Dear Sir/Madam,

I wish to refer to the discussions within the framework of the AFI Planning and Implementation Regional Group (APIRG) on the implementation of Automatic Dependent Surveillance-Contract (ADS-C) / Controller-Pilot Data Link Communication (ADS-C/CPDLC), more particularly the availability of requisite training.

In an effort to support AFI Member States in meeting the requirement for the above-mentioned training, I am pleased to inform you that ICAO, in collaboration with the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) and International Air Transport Association (IATA), is organizing an Operational Data Link Familiarization Seminar, to which your Administration/Organization is invited to participate. The seminar will be hosted by Kenya Civil Aviation Authority (KCAA) in Nairobi, Kenya from 2 to 6 November 2015. The venue will be communicated in due course.

The objective of the seminar is to provide the necessary knowledge and guidance to States and their air navigation services providers (ANSP) for effective implementation of ADS-C/CPDLC. The seminar will also present a networking and knowledge-sharing opportunity through which participants can share best practices and lessons learned.

The seminar will consist of presentations by subject matter experts from the member States in the AFI region, the United States, Canada and Australia on contents of Global Operational Data Link (GOLD) Manual (Doc 10037) in preparation and implementation issues, challenges and lessons learned. A group exercise for development of implementation programme and equipment familiarization is also being considered. The seminar will be conducted in English language and all documents will be provided in electronic format only. Therefore, participants should bring along their laptop computers in order to participate effectively during the seminar.

The provisional programme is provided in **Attachment A**, which will be tailored to address the needs of the seminar participants. In this regard, a survey form provided in **Attachment B** has been prepared to collect information on the status of ADS-C/CPDLC implementation and expectations on the seminar. A registration form for participants is provided at **Attachment C**.

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The final seminar programme and information bulletin providing useful information for participants, including the venue of the meeting and recommended hotels, will be made available on the website of Eastern and Southern African (ESAF) Office in due course.

The GOLD Manual (Doc 10037) provides guidance and information concerning CPDLC and ADS-C operations and is intended to facilitate the uniform application of Standards and Recommended Practices contained in Annex 2 – Rules of the Air, Annex 10 – Aeronautical Communications (Volumes II and III), and Annex 11 – Air Traffic Services, as well as the provisions in the Procedures for Air Navigation Services – Air Traffic Management (PANS-ATM, Doc 4444) and, when necessary, the Regional Supplementary Procedures (Doc 7030). The GOLD Manual together with the Performance-based Communication and Surveillance (PBCS) Manual (Doc 9869) will supersede the regional Global Operational Data Link Document.
