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#### **USAP-CMA Objective**



The objective of the USAP-CMA is to promote global aviation security through continuous auditing and monitoring of Member States' aviation security performance by:

 regularly and continuously obtaining and analysing data on Member States' aviation security performance, including the level of implementation of the critical elements of an aviation security oversight system and the degree of compliance with Standards of Annex 17 — Security and the relevant securityrelated provisions of Annex 9 — Facilitation, as well as associated procedures, guidance material and security-related practices;

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#### **USAP-CMA Objective**



- identifying deficiencies in the overall aviation security performance of Member States and assessing the risks associated with such deficiencies;
- providing prioritized recommendations to assist Member States in addressing identified deficiencies;
- evaluating and validating corrective actions taken by Member States; and
- re-assessing Member States' aviation security performance, in order to continuously enhance their aviation security oversight and compliance capabilities.

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## State's Aviation Security Performance Indicators





The State's aviation security performance is defined as the State's level of implementation of the critical elements of an aviation security oversight system and the State's degree of compliance with Annex 17 Standards and security-related provisions of Annex 9.


Average lack of compliance with Annex 17 Standards and average lack of compliance with security-related provisions of Annex 9.


#### Oversight Indicator


Average lack of effective implementation of the eight critical elements of an aviation security oversight system.


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
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





















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### Actions to be implemented by States



- Sign and submit the MOU to ICAO
- Identify and appoint a National Coordinator
- Complete and maintain up-to-date the State Aviation Security Activity Questionnaire (SASAQ)

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## Actions to be implemented by States



- Complete and maintain up-to-date the Compliance Checklists (CCs)
- Prepare for, and participate in, USAP-CMA activities on the determined dates
- If a preliminary SSeC is confirmed, take appropriate and immediate action to resolve or mitigate it

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### Actions to be implemented by States



- Prepare a Corrective Action Plan to address identified deficiencies
- Comment on the USAP-CMA Audit Report
- · Correct identified deficiencies, as applicable
- Prepare and submit updates to the Corrective Action Plan, as required

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### **Actions to be implemented by States**



- Complete the State Audit Feedback Form
- Carry out all other actions as detailed in the MOU

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# Actions to be taken by the National Coordinator



- Act as contact/focal point for ICAO/ASA with respect to USAP-CMA
- Ensure the initial signature and submission of the MOU to ICAO
- Ensure that the SASAQ and the CCs are duly completed and submitted to ICAO/ASA

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## Actions to be taken by the National Coordinator



- Ensure that the SASAQ and the CCs are maintained upto-date
- Arrange for the submission of any additional State documentation/clarifications
- Coordinate preparation activities with ASA

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# Actions to be taken by the National Coordinator



- Advise State participants of USAP-CMA on-site mission dates and identify/verify their availability
- Distribute the USAP-CMA Protocol Questions to the relevant State and airport-level entities for preparation of evidence and documentation
- Coordinate the locations/times of the National Briefing and Post-audit Debriefing and ensure the attendance of appropriate State participants

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# Actions to be taken by the National Coordinator



- Coordinate State participant activities during the USAP-CMA on-site mission
- Coordinate the preparation and submission of the State's Corrective Action Plan, including any subsequent updates
- Coordinate the State's comments on the USAP-CMA Audit Report and their submission to ICAO by the determined date
- Coordinate the submission of the State Audit Feedback Form

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## **Responsibilities of ICAO**



- ICAO HQ/ASA
  - Develop, implement and maintain USAP-CMA
  - Manage USAP-CMA plan of activities
  - Conduct analysis and measurement of States' aviation security performance indicators and USAP-CMA key parameters
  - Prepare and submit USAP-CMA Audit Reports to States
  - Review, evaluate and provide comments on Corrective Action Plans submitted by States

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
### Actions to be taken by ICAO



- ICAO Regional Offices
  - Assist in the coordination of USAP-CMA activities
  - Institute follow-up discussions with States on the implementation of their Corrective Action Plans
  - Ensure that corrective actions are taken by States in their regions in a timely manner
  - Provide input to ASA on the selection and prioritization of USAP-CMA activities

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### **USAP**



- For over a decade, ICAO has performed aviation security audits under the framework of the USAP.
- ICAO has evaluated compliance with Annex 17 and the oversight capabilities of its Member States, as well as monitored their corrective actions as they progress in improving global aviation security.
- The Member States were extremely pleased with the success of the USAP and its results.

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### **USAP**



- Under CMA, the objective of the USAP is to promote global aviation security through continuous auditing and monitoring of Member States' aviation security compliance and oversight capabilities.
- The USAP-CMA will enable ICAO to enhance States' compliance and oversight capabilities by:
  - Prioritizing audit and monitoring activities;
  - Identifying security deficiencies and assessing associated risks;
  - Providing prioritized recommendations; and
  - Continuously re-evaluating States' compliance and oversight capabilities.
