I have the honour to invite your Administration/Organization to participate in the ICAO/IMO Search and Rescue Global Maritime Distress and Safety System (SAR GMDSS) Sub-Regional Conference, Bahrain, **21-22 October 2014.** The conference, dedicated to the Gulf Cooperation Council (GCC) States, will be organized by the Kingdom of Bahrain, in cooperation with the International Civil Aviation Organization (ICAO) and the International Maritime Organization (IMO). In this respect, I would like to express my appreciation to the Ministry of Transportation of the Kingdom of Bahrain for supporting the ICAO/IMO activities by hosting this important SAR event.

It is to be highlighted that other SAR Stakeholders (Military, Coast Guard, and Maritime) have been invited to the event. Therefore, you are kindly requested to coordinate as necessary to agree on the Party that will present the SAR status of your State.

The Conference is expected to reach an agreement on the way forward. This could be for instance the development of a regional agreement on co-operation in respect of maritime and aeronautical SAR, providing a training course for SAR Administrators, or organising a regional SAR Seminar where other bordering countries will be invited. Other outcomes would be considered during the Conference.

Please note that the Department of Ports and Maritime Affairs of the Ministry of Transportation of Bahrain has sent an advanced notification of this Conference at an earlier stage, indicating that the targeted audience are experts from the Civil Aviation Authorities, the Coast Guard and those in charge of SAR services to take part in this conference.

BULLETIN

1. LOCATION

1.1 The ICAO/IMO Search and Rescue Global Maritime Distress and Safety System (SAR GMDSS) Sub-Regional Conference will be held in Bahrain, on 21 and 22 October 2014. The meeting will take place at the Awali Ballroom, Sheraton Bahrain Hotel.

2. SCHEDULE OF THE MEETING

- 2.1 The opening session of the meeting will be held at 0900 hours on Tuesday, 21 October 2014.
- 2.2 The daily schedule and the order of the day will be announced at the opening session.
- 2.3 The meeting will be conducted in English.

3. REGISTRATION OF PARTICIPANTS

3.1 Participants are requested to register, at the Registration Desk located at the entrance of the Meeting Hall, between 0800 and 0900 hours on the opening day of the meeting. Participants are also requested to wear the Identification Badge which will be issued to them during registration.

4. DOCUMENTATION

4.1 Kindly note that no documentation in hard copy will be available. Participants are requested to bring along their own hard copies or their laptops to the Seminar, as appropriate.

5. HOTEL RESERVATIONS/RETURN AIRLINE BOOKINGS

5.1 Participants are requested to ensure that their return airline booking is confirmed, soon after their arrival in Bahrain, through their respective hotel reception desk. A list of recommended hotels' with corporate rates is attached for your convenience with the telephone/fax numbers and addresses. Participants will need to arrange their own hotel reservations.

6. TRANSPORTATION

- 6.1 Participants are requested to make their own arrangements for transportation from the airport to the city and return.
- 6.2 Airport Taxi Services operate from the Airport to Bahrain downtown costing approximately 5 Bahraini Dinars per vehicle.

7. INSURANCE

7.1 Participants are advised to have insurance coverage for any unexpected contingency including transport hazards (taxi, buses, rented cars etc.) and Medical Coverage.

8. SOME USEFUL TRAVEL INFORMATION

PASSPORT

8.1 All foreign nationals entering Bahrain must possess valid passports or other valid documents for travel.

VISA

8.2 It is mandatory that all participants obtain official visas from the Bahraini Embassy or Consulate in their country prior to their departure for Bahrain.

CUSTOMS

8.3 For a list of Items Prohibited in Bahrain/ Controlled and Restricted Items by Bahrain Customs www.bahraincustoms.gov.bh. Additional quantities of restricted items may also be purchased from the Airport duty free shop after clearing customs. There is no restriction on the value of personal gifts.

9. CURRENCY, CREDIT CARDS AND BANKING SERVICES

- 9.1 Currency in Bahrain is the **Bahraini Dinar (BHD)**. Current rate of exchange is: US\$ 1 = BHD 0.377 (or BHD 1 = US\$ 2.65) approximately.
- 9.2 There are no restrictions on import of foreign currency.
- 9.3 International Credit Cards, such as American Express, Diners Club, Visa, Mastercard, Carte Blanche, etc. are usually accepted at most hotels, department stores and restaurants.
- 9.4 All commercial banks exchange major foreign currencies and are open from 0800 to 1300 hours, Sundays through Thursdays.

10. OTHER USEFUL INFORMATION

SHOPPING

10.1 Shopping areas are available in Bahrain. Be prepared to bargain in small shops, sidewalk vendors etc. In large stores, however, the prices are fixed.

TAP WATER

10.2 It is recommended that all visitors drink only bottled water/beverages.

TELEPHONE AND INTERNET CARDS

10.3 Cards are available in the Bahrain Market for international calls, and internet connection.

11. WEATHER CONDITIONS

11.1 The main daily minimum and maximum temperatures for the month of October in Bahrain are between 25° C to 30° C.

GUIDELINES FOR PRESENTATIONS ON NATIONAL SAR SYSTEM

Each country is invited to deliver a presentation on the national SAR system and are kindly requested to take into consideration this information when preparing their presentations:

- 1. Presentations should not last more than 15 minutes.
- 2. Presentations should be prepared using Microsoft Power Point, if available.
- 3. The presentation should include, the following information, where applicable:
 - 1. Delimitation of SAR region
 - 2. Agency responsible to coordinate aeronautical and maritime SAR;
 - 3. Introduction of designated SAR units
 - 4. Agency responsible to provide medical advice to vessels or aircraft
 - Brief information on Rescue Coordination Centre (RCC), or Joint RCC and sub-RCC, if any.
 - 6. Procedures for coordinating aeronautical and maritime search and rescue (national SAR Plan for division of responsibilities between government agencies for SAR matters)
 - 7. Communication facilities in RCC and sub-RCC
 - 8. Equipment for receiving distress alerts (shore-based GMDSS equipment)
 - 9. National SAR training capacity
