# MID SSR CODE MANAGEMENT PLAN (CMP)

# 1. Introduction

- 1.1 The meeting may wish to recall that the Middle East Secondary Surveillance Code Management Plan (CMP) has been produced on behalf of the Middle East Air Navigation Planning and Implementation Regional Group (MIDANPIRG).
- 1.2 The foundation of the SSR code allocation is included in the MID eANP volume II, Table ATM II-MID-2: MID Region SSR CMP.
- 1.3 The Middle East SSR Code Management Plan (MID Doc 005: MID SSR CMP) has been established to provide States in the ICAO MID Region with means to coordinate the use of SSR codes based on the principles of the Originating Region Code Assignment Method (ORCAM), which provides for the most efficient and economical use of codes. The plan is published under the ICAO MID Website.
- 1.4 The purpose of MID CMP is to detail the requirements to be met by the MID States to comply with the provisions of the Middle East Air Navigation Plan (MID ANP) (ICAO Doc 9708) as it pertains the management of Secondary Surveillance Radar (SSR) codes in the ICAO MID Region.
- 1.5 The MID SSR Code Allocation List (CAL) is available at Middle East Air Navigation Plan, Volume II, Table ATM II-MID-2.

# 2. DISCUSSION

- 2.1 The management of the MID SSR CMP is exercised by the ICAO MID Regional Office. States expecting to introduce or change SSR facilities are requested to advise the ICAO MID Regional Office well in advance, in order to provide sufficient time to carry out any necessary coordination and checks for the changes.
- 2.2 In order to serve their purposes, it is imperative that the MID SSR CMP list is kept up to date. States are therefore required to inform the MID Office of ICAO promptly of any requests for changes, additions, or deletions in regard to the use of specific codes.
- 2.3 In performing this objective, ATM SG/8 was tasked Secretariate to develop required dashboard for monitoring of allocated SSR codes to the MID States taking into account the followings procedures:
  - a) for temporary allocation of reserved SSR Code, States are required to request officially from ICAO MID.
  - b) the temporary reserved SSR code will be assigned for the requesting State for the duration of Six months, unless otherwise stated; from date of allocation by ICAO MID. After this period, the allocated SSR code will be released for another usage unless the relevant state request officially to extent duration of usage for another cycle or certain additional duration. At any case, this request shall be confirmed by ICAO MID Office.
  - c) ICAO MID Office keep the dashboard updated and provide required reports to ATM SG meeting.
- Based on the above, ICAO MID Office developed required dashboard to manage SSR Code List as well as with contribution of the MID States, reviewed and updated SSR Code Management Plan. The PfA at **Appendix A** is presented to MIDANPIRG/20 for final review and endorsement. Accordingly, the ATM SG/8 meeting agreed to the following Draft Conclusion:

# e) Originator's Comments

The changes proposed herein are the result of work undertaken by the MIDANPIRG ATM SG/8 meeting; and the coordinating with MID States to minimize impact of SSR Code duplication to misidentification of air traffic.

In addition, based on ANC resolution C-DEC 225/10 and establishment of Doha FIR/SRR, it is required to allocated separate SSR codes for transit and domestic operation of Doha FIR.

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# f) Secretariat's Comments

The ICAO Secretariate was fully engaged in the work of the ATM SG and coordination with states and therefore, fully support this amendment.

The task was initiated by the ATM SG/7 meeting (Virtual, 15 - 18 November 2021), finalized by the ATM SG/8 meeting (Amman, Jordan, 07 - 10 November 2022), endorsed by the MIDANPIRG/20 meeting (Muscat, Oman, 14-17 May 2023) and facilitated by the Secretariat.
