
1. Introduction

- 1.1 The Standards, Recommended Practices and Procedures and guidance material related to the implementation of Search and Rescue (SAR) are mainly contained in ICAO Annex 12, International Aeronautical and Maritime Search and Rescue Manual (IAMSAR Doc 9731). On regional level, the MID SAR implementation Plan was endorsed and published as MID Doc 010, in 2018.
- 1.2 Furthermore, the 6th edition of GANP, under ASBU GADS B1/2, which was identified as Priority 1 in the MID Region Air Navigation Strategy, is related to Global Aeronautical Distress and Safety System (GADSS) Operational Control Directory, is applicable to all MID States (100% by 2021).

2. DISCUSSION

- 2.1 The meeting may wish to recall that SAR main findings and challenges identified earlier in the MID Region are still standing for long duration, the findings are mainly related to the lack of:
 - effective SAR oversight activities;
 - English language proficiency for RCC radio operators;
 - appropriate training programmes/plans of SAR experts;

- signature of SAR bi-lateral Agreements (current signed agreements as of Oct 2022 is at Appendix A);
- plans of operations for the conduct of SAR operations and SAR exercises;
- provision of required SAR services; and
- non-compliance with the carriage of Emergency Locator Transmitter (ELT) requirements.
- 2.2 The meeting may wish to note the status of the reported SAR bilateral Arrangements, as of November 2022, **at Appendix A**; which is also reflected in the following Graph 1:

- 2.3 MID States were urged to keep up-to-date their SAR Point of Contact (SPOC) contact details in their AIPs (GEN 3.6) and on the COSPAS-SARSAT website: http://www.cospas-sarsat.int/en/, It is also requested to provide ICAO MID with the assigned person(s) to be included in the GADSS Contacts directory. The current list is at **Appendix B**.
- 2.4 The meeting may wish to recall that the MID Doc. 010: SAR implementation Plan, includes material that would support the implementation of different requirements:
 - SAR Facilities and resources reference material, including national implementation guidance plan;
 - Check list for SAR capability matrix;
 - SAR LoA template;
 - Work plan for SAREX meeting; and
 - MID States Contact details table.
- 2.5 The current implementation status of ASBU GADS B1/2: Operational Control Directory is 73%, while the targets was 100% by 2021 (WP/38 refers).
- 1.3 The meeting may wish to recall that ICAO MID Office was encouraged to explore means to support MID States in eliminating SAR findings and deficiencies by, in particular, organizing a SAR implementation Seminar.
- 1.4 Based on the above the meeting is invited to agree on the following Decision, emanating from the ATM SG/8 meeting:

DRAFT CONCLUSION 8/4: SAR WORKSHOP

That, the ICAO MID Office organize a SAR Workshop in 2023, to address the challenges related to SAR in the MID Region.

1.5 Based on the presentation provided by UAE during the ATM SG/8 meeting, related to the developments related to the SAR field within UAE; in particular the SAR Regulations (UAE CAR SAR) the certification of SAR Providers, and the establishment of a dedicated National Search and Rescue Center (NSRC) that is in charge of providing SAR within Emirates SRR. UAE offered in principle the intention of hosting a Regional Seminar to support SAR implementation within the Region, including topics of establishing regulatory framework and oversight programme for Search and Rescue.

3. ACTION BY THE MEETING

- 3.1 The meeting is invited to:
 - a) encourage States to use the ICAO Doc 010 to support the SAR implementation; and provide ICAO MID Office with regular updates on the implementation status, achievements and challenges;
 - b) explore ways and means to further support MID States in the elimination the longstanding SAR findings and deficiencies; including the organization of SAR Seminar;
 - c) review and, update as deemed necessary:
 - i. the status of bilateral Arrangements between ANSPs/ACCs at Appendix A;
 - ii. the SAR Point of Contact (SPOC) contact details on the COSPAS-SARSAT website: http://www.cospas-sarsat.int/en/; and
 - iii. the list of SAR and GADSS focal points in the MID Region at **Appendix B**; to be included in GADSS repository.
