

## 2. Strategic options for training programmers beneficiaries

2.1 Given that it should meet training requirements urgently, AFCAC has been looking for partners likely to secure funding, mainly in the form of training programmes. Through its contacts, AFCAC has been able to launch two training fellowship with the Civil Aviation authority of Singapore (CAAS) on one hand and Egypt on the other hand.

### 2.1.1 CAAS Training fellowships

2.1.1.1 Under the above programme, 34 African experts took part in training sessions at the Singapore Aviation School as it appears in the table below:

2.1.2 AFCAC and CAAS are currently looking into the possibility of extending this programme to other sectors.

### 2.2 Egyptian Fellowship Programme

2.2.1 Under the Egyptian fellowship programme, AFCAC and the Egyptian Civil Aviation Authority (ECAA) did sign a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) in January 2001.

2.2.2 Under the above-named MOU, 30 training fellowships will be offered to AFCAC member States over a five-year period. These fellowships cover training fees and NCATO civil aviation training school. To date, 7 (seven) states have submitted their applications for these fellowships. The selection of the first candidates will be carried out during the weeks to come.
