Financing for Sustainable Growth of Aviation

The First ICAO World Aviation Forum concluded that aviation has a significant impact on the sustainable development of States, regions and the world; it impacts tourism and trade, and generates other economic benefits which help eradicate poverty and create jobs. It is the most efficient means to deliver humanitarian aid. It was highlighted, however, that despite its economic significance, the aviation sector receives limited funds to support its sustainable development.

This session will share best practices and experiences on how States can mobilize resources for the three pillars of sustainable development for aviation through various financial mechanisms. Panellists will address constraints and impediments to the partnership and financing for a sustainable aviation future.
