


International Legal framework in Civil Aviation:

- ✓ 27 Multilateral instruments under ICAO aegis;
- ✓ 7 Multilateral instruments under EUROCONTROL aegis;
- ✓ 2 Multilateral arrangements under JAA aegis.

Regional Co-operation

- Unique System of 25 bilateral ASA (1992 2006) + "Horizontal Agreement";
- EU announced initiative to conclude ECAA Agreement with Ukraine (September 2005);
- Negotiations on ECAA Agreement are planned;

Horizontal Agreement Ukraine - EU

- Signed on 1 December 2005
- Progressive step towards to amend 25 ASA;
- All agreements between Ukraine and EU Member States are covered;
- Clarity for further actions required is identified;
- 25 bilateral ASA to be further modernized on bilateral basis;
- Bilateral negotiations process is underway;
- Co-operation with EU is enhanced to pave the way to a comprehensive Ukraine – EU aviation agreement.

Constraints to Liberalization

- Non complete regulatory framework;
- Limited capacity of airports;
- Limited investment in infrastructure;
- Disbalance in access to some markets;

Conclusions

Paths to further liberalization:

- Gradual liberalization within the bilateral framework;
- A lead sector approach;
- Phased multilateralism (plurilateralism);
- Improvement of competitiveness of national airlines on cost, service and product
- Increase of the airports capacity
