• The WASA Database includes agreements that are officially registered with ICAO (Art. 83 of the Chicago Convention), as well as other agreements and arrangements, which are publicly available.

• States have an obligation, established under the Chicago Convention, to register aeronautical arrangements, including air services agreements, with ICAO. ICAO has promulgated rules to govern the registration process which can be found in Doc 6685- Rules for Registration with ICAO of Aeronautical Agreements and Arrangements.


