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

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
Connectivity: Huge potential for Africa






IMPROVING COMPETITIVENESS OF ECOWAS DESTINATIONS

Relative cost of access (ticket taxes and airport charges) to international air transport services



Competitiveness affects ability to deliver value


Quality of Air Transport Infrastructure (Ranking / 140 countries)

Africa without Borders...




• Rwanda and Mauritius, who are in the top 10 most visa-open countries, are leading the way in making the concept of "One Africa" possible.



MUCH NEEDED AIRLINE CONTRIBUTION




Airlines need to be profitable to support connectivity
