### Department of Homeland Security Tools Available to Public Health Authorities

- Do Not Board (DNB) List
  - Lookout (LO) List

#### **Do Not Board List**

- Transportation Security Administration (TSA)
- Prevents persons with (suspect or known) diseases from obtaining boarding passes
- Established in June 2007
  - Stringent, multi-layered approval process
  - CDC Ethics Workgroup

#### **Do Not Board List**

- Applies to foreign nationals and U.S. citizens
- All flights departing from, arriving into, and flying within the United States
- DNB list is NOT part of the "No Fly" List
- International notifications
  - Canada and Mexico notified of every DNB actions
  - Other countries notified per protocol

#### **Lookout List**

- Customs and Border Protection (CBP)
- Applies to international arrivals at U.S. airports, seaports, and land borders
- Prompts CBP staff to notify CDC quarantine staff when such persons attempt to enter the U.S.

## Do Not Board and Lookout Lists Placement Criteria

Person with disease of public health concern

Infectious

and

Non-adherent or unaware of diagnosis

and

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### **Process for DNB/LO Requests**

CDC QS receives request

CDC and local/state health departments discuss and concur with request

Starts with notification from local/state public health authority to CDC Quarantine Station (QS)

CDC DGMQ Office of the Director official approves the request

Official request sent to CDC Emergency Operations Center



Official request to Health and Human Services

Official request to DHS

**Notification to TSA** 

**Notification to CBP** 

### Follow Up

- Quarantine station staff notifies state and local health authorities when DNB/LO action confirmed
  - Health department staff notifies the individual
  - Quarantine station staff sends a letter to individual explaining the action
- Health department staff work with individual to meet criteria for removal from the lists

#### Follow-Up

- QS staff can request that an airline waive fees associated with changing travel date
- TRIA lead initiates international notifications of public health agencies
  - Department of State
  - Ministry of Health



#### **Removal from DNB List**

- Basically the reverse of addition
- When the individual is non-contagious
- Request for removal is made by the state TB Controller and / or local health department
- We review cases at least every 2
- We notify the airlines for internal list removal to avoid unnecessary inconvenience to passengers

#### **Criteria for Removal from Lists**

- Clarified at time of DNB/Lookout order
  - DGMQ applies algorithm developed by Division of TB Elimination
- Generally requires
  - If not MDR TB, at least 2 weeks of adequate treatment and demonstration of smear negativity
  - If MDR TB, at least 4 weeks of adequate treatment and demonstration of culture negativity



### Time to Add or Remove Individuals from the Lists

- On average
  - 8 hours to add
  - 10 hours to remove
- Emergency addition or removal may be requested

#### **Travel Restriction Data\***


- 190 total persons added to the DNB/LO
- All because of pulmonary tuberculosis
- 18 persons added at Canada's request
- Removed 152 persons
- 2 persons intercepted by CBP at US-Canada border because of the lookout
- 140 persons continued or returned to treatment after listing

-	+	No	≥1 week	Yes	N/A
-	+	No	<1week	No	Tx ≥ 1 week

-	+	Yes	N/A	No	≥ 2 neg Cx obtained after ≥ 2 weeks of Tx and Tx for ≥ 4 weeks
