



Jean-Michel AUBAS Director of the Civil Aviation Technical Center

Jean-Michel AUBAS began his career in 1975 at the DGAC (French CAA) where he held several roles of increasing responsibility starting as the Manager of the Data Center of the Finance and Human Resources Department. He subsequently spent three years in Guadeloupe (French Antilla) where he held the position of civil aviation regional director followed by 10 years in the Airport Department, in charge of airport economical control, airport planning, environment and security.

In 1994 he joined SOFREAVIA SERVICE, a civil aviation consultant company and two years later was promoted as CEO. He created and served as Chairman of SIMULAVIA, a company designing and implementing radar and tower simulators. During that time he spent several years as director in the board of various companies working in aviation (SEGAP for Airport management, Abidjan Airport, GSAC for airworthiness oversight).

Jean-Michel AUBAS returned back to the DGAC in 2002 where he oversaw the reorganisation of the DGAC in compliance with the Single European Sky regulations.. From 2005 to 2007 he was in charge of the security for land and sea transport.

He is now holding the position of director of the Civil Aviation Technical Center of the DGAC and is also director of the board of Toulouse Airport

Jean-Michel AUBAS is a graduate of "Ecole Polytechnique" (1973) and of the French Civil Aviation Institute (ENAC) (1975). He is also a private pilot (instrumented rate).
