#### 1. SCHEDULE OF THE MEETING

1.1 The opening session of the eighth meeting of the International Airways Volcano Watch Operations Group (IAVWOPSG/8) will be held at 1000 hours on Monday 17 February 2014 in the 6th floor conference room of the Bureau of Meteorology, Head Office, Melbourne, Australia.

#### 5. **WORKING HOURS**

- 5.1 The expected daily working hours are as follows:
  - a) 17 February 2014 from 1000 to 1600 hours;
  - b) 18 and 19 February 2014 from 0900 to 1600 hours; and
  - c) 20 February 2014 from 0900 to 1230 hours.
- 5.2 There will be a one-hour lunch break from 1200–1300 hours. A coffee/tea break will be provided between 1015–1030 hours. The Order of Business will be distributed on the first day of the meeting.

## 6. LOCATION OF THE BUREAU OF METEOROLOGY HEAD OFFICE

- 6.1 The Bureau of Meteorology is located in the Docklands area adjacent to the Melbourne Central Business District (CBD) at 700 Collins Street, Docklands, Melbourne approximately 2 km from the city centre.
- 6.2 The meeting will take place in Conference Rooms 1 and 2 located on Level 6. Delegates should follow the IAVWOPSG/8 signs to the lifts and then to the conference rooms.
- 6.3 There is public transport close to the Bureau of Meteorology via train, tram or bus. There is an approximate 200 metre walk from the Southern Cross Train Station to the Bureau and the number 31 and 48 tram stops on Collins Street within 100 metres of the Bureau at either stop D8 or D9.

## 8. HOTEL RESERVATIONS, ARRIVAL AND DEPARTURE

- 8.1 Some suggested hotels located close to the Bureau are indicated in Appendix A.
- 8.2 Hotel reservations should be made directly with the selected hotel by telephone/fax/email.
- 8.3 We would suggest you do not choose anything below 3 stars. Please note that the list is not exhaustive.
- 8.4 When requesting a rate ask for the "Corporate Commonwealth Government Rate". However, it is also suggested that prices for hotels be checked through the accommodation websites such as below, as they quite often can offer better rates than the "corporate rates" we would normally obtain.

8.5 Melbourne Airport is located approximately 25 kms from the Melbourne's CBD on the Tullamarine Freeway, less than 25 minutes by car. The following applies to taxis and the airport bus service, Skybus:

#### **Taxis**

Taxis are available from the ground floor (arrivals) level of Melbourne Airport, outside the International Terminal and both Domestic Terminals. Expect a taxi fare of around A\$55 one way between Melbourne Airport and the CBD. The Victorian Government urges travellers to be aware of unlicensed or illegal taxi and chauffeur drivers, also known as "touters", operating at the Melbourne Airport. If you are approached by someone offering to assist you with transport needs, you should decline the invitation and report the incident to the Victorian Taxi Directorate on (03) 9320 4300 or (toll free) 1 800 638 802. Chauffeur services from Melbourne Airport must be pre-booked before your arrival.

#### **Skybus**

Skybus offers a shuttle bus service from the airport to the Melbourne CBD and a free transfer service from the Skybus City Terminal to most city hotels.

The airport to city service operates 24 hours, 7 days a week. Buses run every 10 minutes from 0530 to 2300 and every 15 to 30 minutes overnight.

The Skybus Hotel Transfer Service to most city hotels operates from 0600 to 2200 Monday to Friday, and 0730 to 1830 Saturday and Sunday.

Prices as of August 2013: Adult one way tickets cost \$17 / \$28 return.

#### 9. OTHER USEFUL INFORMATION

#### 9.1 **Average weather conditions**

9.1.1 In Melbourne, the mean temperatures during the month of February are a minimum of 14.6°C and a maximum of 25.8°C. The highest recorded maximum temperature is 46.4°C and the highest minimum temperature recorded is 30.5°C. On average there is 47.3 mm of rainfall in February. ### 9.2 Exchange rates and credit cards

- 9.2.1 The currency is the Australian dollar (AUD). You will need to check the exchange rate closer to your departure, but as of 21 August 2013, \$1.00 AUD is worth: 5.05ARS, 0.94 CAD, 464.57 CLP, 5.53 CNY, 4.41 FRF, 0.64 EUR, 87.87 JPY, 1.14 NZD, 0.58 GBD, 0.90 USD, 458 XOF, and 0.83 CHF. There are official money exchanges at Australian airports and throughout the CBD and some are open 24 hours per day. There are also banks and other official money exchanges located in Melbourne but most are only open from 09:00 to 17:00, Monday to Friday. There are many automatic teller machines (ATMs) available throughout the city, suburbs and regional locations.
- 9.2.2 Visa, Mastercard, Diners and American Express credit cards are accepted at the majority of hotels and restaurants. However, please note that many retail outlets and restaurants place a surcharge (~2.5 per cent) on the use of Diners and American Express cards.

#### 9.3 **Electricity**
