THE SIXTH MEETING OF THE SADIS COST RECOVERY ADMINISTRATIVE GROUP (SCRAG/6)

(Paris, 21 and 22 November 2005)

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INTRODUCTION

Place and duration

i.1 The Sixth Meeting of the SADIS Cost Recovery Administrative Group (SCRAG) was held in the European and North Atlantic (EUR/NAT) ICAO Regional Office, Paris, on 21 and 22 November 2005.

Attendance

i.2 The Meeting was attended by two of the five Members of the Group and two of the three Observers. The list of participants is in **Appendix A** and a list of working papers issued for the Meeting is in **Appendix B**.

Officers and Secretariat

i.3 **Mr. L.J.N. Rolvink**, from the Netherlands, was Chairman of the Meeting. **Mr. J.C. Bugnet**, Chief, Joint Financing Section, ICAO Headquarters, Montreal, acted as Secretary of the Meeting, assisted by **Mr. Guillermo Vega**, Regional Officer.

Agenda Item 7: Other business.

AGENDA ITEM 1: REVIEW OF SCRAG'S TERMS OF REFERENCE, COMPOSITION AND WORKING ARRANGEMENTS

1.1 The Group noted that the Parties to the SADIS Agreement from the European Region still represent in the aggregate more than 50% of the total assessments, which results in the nomination of two SCRAG members from this Region, in accordance with Article VII, paragraph 2 of the SADIS Agreement.

1.2 The Group noted its Terms of Reference assigned by Article VII of the SADIS Agreement, which reads:

"The SADIS Cost Allocation and Recovery (SCAR) arrangement shall be administered by a group, the SADIS Cost Recovery Administrative Group (SCRAG) which shall:

- a) assess the annual cost share attributable to each Party, including re-assessments arising from new Parties adhering to this Agreement; and
- b) audit the costs of the SADIS provision and any related financial activities, incurred by the provider State and subject to cost sharing."
- 1.3 The Group was informed that ICAO had received a formal notification of accession to the SADIS Agreement from 44 States, that 11 States had informed ICAO of their intention to accede to the SADIS Agreement but had not yet sent a formal notification of accession and that 37 other States receiving the SADIS service had not yet notified their intention to accede to the SADIS Agreement. It was also informed that from these last 37 States, 19 are Least Developed Countries (LDCs), which are exempted from payment of SADIS cost share.

AGENDA ITEM 2: CONSIDERATION OF ISSUES RELEVANT TO THE SCRAG'S WORK ADDRESSED BY THE SADIS OPERATIONS GROUP (SADISOPSG)

- 2.1 The Group was informed of the main conclusions of the Tenth Meeting of the SADIS Operations Group (SADISOPSG/10, Paris, 24 to 27 May 2005) provided by the Chairman of SADISOPSG in the Executive Summary of Discussions of this meeting.
- 2.2 The Group noted the Statement of SADIS operational efficacy received from the Chairman of SADISOPSG relaying the advice from the Group at its Tenth meeting (SADISOPSG/10, Paris, 24 to 27 May 2005) to SCRAG that the operational efficacy of the SADIS had continued to be satisfactory meeting all operational requirements since the SADISOPSG/9 Meeting (Dakar, 1 to 4 June 2004).
- 2.3 The Group noted Conclusion 10/7 of SADISOPSG/10 instructing the Chairman of SADISOPSG to forward to the Chairman of SCRAG an updated SADIS Inventory. This proposal is dealt with under Agenda Item 5 (See below paragraphs 5.1, 5.2 and **Appendix I**).

AGENDA ITEM 3: REVIEW OF ACTUAL SADIS COSTS AND COST SHARES FOR THE PERIOD 1 JANUARY TO 31 DECEMBER 2004

Review of the 2004 Actual SADIS Costs

3.1 The Group reviewed the actual costs of providing the SADIS services in the year 2004. These actual costs are presented in **Appendix E** and total £566 888. A summary of these costs is presented in **Table 1**.

Review of the 2004 Actual SADIS Cost Shares

- 3.2 The Group noted that one State, Mongolia, which was assessed for the year 2004 by the SCRAG/4 Meeting, did not have an operational equipment. Consequently, its share of the actual costs for 2004 is nil.
- 3.3 The Group noted that the Russian Federation, which was not assessed for the year 2004 by the SCRAG/4 Meeting, has had the SADIS service withdrawn on 6 August 2002 but reinstated in January 2004. Consequently, the share of the actual costs for 2004 for the Russian Federation was calculated based on 11 full months of service in 2004.
- 3.4 The Group determined the actual cost shares for the period 1 January to 31 December 2004 to be borne by the States party to the SADIS Agreement which are not exempted because they are on the list of the Least Developed Countries or because they denied their accession to the SADIS Agreement, on the basis of their number of ATKs in scheduled services for 2004, in accordance with Article XI, paragraph 3 of the SADIS Agreement. The cost share in percentage terms and the share in £ sterling to be borne by each State participating in the SADIS Cost Allocation and Recovery (SCAR) Arrangement are shown in **Appendix E**. Accordingly the Group formulated the following Conclusion:

Conclusion 6/1 -

The actual cost shares for 2004 as shown in Appendix E to the SCRAG/6 Report for the States participating in the SCAR Arrangement are approved by the SCRAG/6 Meeting, in view of the adjustments to be made by the CAA of the United Kingdom in its billing of these States.

- 3.5 The Group received information from the observer from the United Kingdom on the status of payment of the cost shares of 2004 as at 18 October 2005. It noted that a total amount of £440 268 was collected and a total amount of credit balance from 2002 of £31 042 was applied against the assessments for 2004, both amounts representing 86.0% of the original assessments for 2004 as approved by the SCRAG/4 Meeting and of the additional assessments for 2004 subsequent to the SCRAG/4 Meeting.
- Having noted the information in Table 1 and paragraphs 3.2 to 3.5 above, the Group agreed that the net amount of the under-recovery of SADIS cost shares for the year 2004 amounts to £65 224 as shown in **Table 2**. This under-recovery is the difference between the actual costs for 2004 (£566 888), to which the over-recovery for 2002 is subtracted (£34 707) in order to obtain the amount subject to collection for 2004, and the collections from States for 2004 (£440 268 as shown in

Appendix G - Table 1) plus the collections from States for years prior to 2004 after 12 October 2004 (£26 689 as shown in **Appendix G - Table 2**), and it formulated the following Conclusion:

Conclusion 6/2 -

A net under-recovery, amounting to £65 224 of the SADIS cost shares for the year 2004 will be taken into account in the calculation of the SADIS cost shares for the year 2006, in accordance with Article XI, paragraph 4 of the SADIS Agreement.

Depreciated Assets

3.7 The Group noted the information presented by the UK regarding the depreciated assets as at 31 December 2005 (see **Appendix C**).

AGENDA ITEM 4: REVIEW OF ESTIMATED SADIS COSTS AND COST SHARES FOR THE PERIOD 1 JANUARY TO 31 DECEMBER 2006

Review of the 2006 Estimated SADIS Costs

- 4.1 The Group reviewed the cost estimates for providing the SADIS services in the year 2006. These cost estimates are detailed in **Appendix F** and total £668 921. A summary of these costs is presented in **Table 3** below.
- 4.2 The Group noted that the ICAO administrative cost in support of SADIS will include, as of 1 January 2006, the cost of the services provided by ICAO to the SADIS Operations Group (SADISOPSG). The Group was informed that, according to a legal opinion from the Director of the Legal Bureau of ICAO, approved by the President of the Council, this addition did not require any amendment to Article VIII and/or Annex III to the SADIS Agreement. While accepting these estimates, the Members of the SCRAG questioned this interpretation of the Agreement and mentioned that their States might propose an amendment to the Agreement to clarify the situation.

4.3 The Group considered a proposal by the provider State for enhancements of the FTP Service and the corresponding budget estimates. The Group noted that the estimated costs of £22 000 in 2006 represent provisional figures not including maintenance costs. As a result of its deliberations, the Group adopted the following Conclusion:

Conclusion 6/3 -

In view of the increasing use of the SADIS FTP Service as a primary source of operational data the SCRAG approves in principle the budgetary costs presented by the SADIS provider State. The SCRAG invites the SADIS provider to complete a detailed implementation plan in time for SADISOPSG/11 and to advise SCRAG/7 as to whether any amendments to the budgetary figures are required.

4.4 The Group agreed that any increase of the total SADIS costs by more than 2% as compared with the estimates should be submitted for SCRAG' approval by correspondence before its implementation.

4.5 The Group considered the under-recovery in **Table 2** above in the calculation of the amount to be assessed under the SADIS Agreement for 2006. The calculation of the amount to be assessed is presented in **Table 4**.

Review of the 2006 Estimated SADIS Cost Shares

- The Group determined the cost shares for the period 1 January to 31 December 2006 to be borne by the States parties to the SADIS Agreement which are not exempted because they are on the list of the Least Developed Countries, on the basis of the number of available tonne-kilometres (ATKs) in scheduled services for 2004, in accordance with Article XI, paragraph 3 of the SADIS Agreement. The Group noted that from the eight new receiver States (Afghanistan, Iceland, Ireland, Poland, Qatar, Republic of Korea, the former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia and Zimbabwe), one State, Afghanistan, is a Least Developed Country and is thus exempted from payment of the SADIS cost share and the other States are included in the calculation of the assessment of cost shares for 2006. The cost share in percentage terms and the share in £ sterling, including the share of under-recovery for 2004, to be borne by each State are shown in **Appendix H**.
- 4.7 Due the importance of the under recovery for 2004, the Group agreed that the figures in Conclusion 6.2, Tables 2 &4 above, and in **Appendix H** will be updated before the United Kingdom proceed to bill each of the States party to the SADIS Agreement for the share attributable to it in 2006, to take into account any payment received between 15 October and 31 December 2005. Accordingly, the Group formulated the following Conclusion:

Conclusion 6/4 -

Subject to updating by the Secretariat to take into account any payment of arrears received between 15 October and 31 December 2005, the estimated cost shares for 2006 as shown in Appendix H to the SCRAG/6 Report for each State participating in the SCAR Arrangement are approved by the SCRAG/6 Meeting for collection by the United Kingdom.

Cost estimates for the years 2007 to 2009

4.8 The Group considered the estimates provided by the United Kingdom (see **Appendix F**) and summarised in **Table 5** of providing the SADIS services for the years 2007 to 2009 as well as the estimates for the United Kingdom administrative costs and the costs of ICAO support services.

AGENDA ITEM 5: AMENDMENTS TO ANNEXES TO THE AGREEMENT ON THE SHARING OF COSTS OF THE SATELLITE DISTRIBUTION SYSTEM RELATING TO AIR NAVIGATION

- 5.1 The Group reviewed the amendments to Annex II, SADIS Inventory, to the SADIS Agreement as proposed by the SADISOPSG and agreed upon by the United Kingdom as the SADIS provider State. These amendments were necessary to ensure that the inventory would continue to meet the approved operational requirements and take account of the implementation of the SADIS FTP service as of 1 July 2005.
- 5.2 The additions and deletions to the existing text of Annex II appear in outline and strikeout formats in **Appendix I**. As a result of its review, the group adopted the following Conclusion:

Conclusion 6/5 -

With the consent of the United Kingdom as the SADIS provider State, in accordance with Article XVII, paragraph 5, of the SADIS Agreement, Annex II, SADIS Inventory of the SADIS Agreement is amended as indicated in Appendix I to the SCRAG/6 Report.

The Group reviewed a proposal by the United Kingdom to amend Annex III, Financial Issues, to the SADIS Agreement. The SADIS provider believes that it is in the users interest to secure longer period contracts for the procured services, where practical. This reduces the amount of administrative effort in setting up and agreeing new contracts and provides greater stability for SADIS users. However, in order to accommodate this, the SADIS provider is seeking an addition to the wording of Annex III to the SADIS Agreement so that any unrecovered costs associated with a long period lease could be recovered in the event of termination of the SADIS Agreement. It proposed the addition of a new note 3 under Chargeable Costs in Annex III, which would read as follows: "In the event this Agreement is terminated, the United Kingdom may, to the extent that it is unable to gain a refund for the unexpired portion of an external contract in support of the SADIS Service, charge the cost of the remaining portion of the contract to the costs recoverable from the participating States in the last year the Agreement remains in force." The Group decided to postpone its decision of this proposal until the SCRAG/7 Meeting.

AGENDA ITEM 6: FUTURE WORK AND ARRANGEMENTS FOR THE SCRAG/7 MEETING

6.1 The Group agreed that, subject to confirmation, its Seventh Meeting should be held in the ICAO Asia and Pacific Region Office (Bangkok) during the first or second week of November 2006.

AGENDA ITEM 7: OTHER BUSINESS

7.1 The Group bade farewell to Mr Jean-Claude Bugnet, Secretary of the SCRAG who is retiring on 30 November 2005 and expressed its appreciation and thanks to the staff of the European and North Atlantic (EUR/NAT) ICAO Regional Office for their hospitality and excellent support received during the meeting.

SADIS INVENTORY

The inventory items identified below cover the equipment and staffing required to provide, operate and maintain the SADIS. The inventory includes: hub infrastructure (including all additions following the completion of the hub enhancement project) and communications circuits, ISCS data back up system, procured services, and staff. It should be noted that some equipment items are under lease and form part of a wider infrastructure. Costs of individual items cannot be separated from the required infrastructure that includes a significant part of the development of the software and technical configuration. The inventory is in accordance with the SADIS User Guide.
