


Passenger traffic evolution and repartition





Passenger Revenue loss (compared to 2019)





90% traffic recovery in 2023 compared to 2019

- Estimated Revenue loss for **2022 USD 3.5 billion**, representing 20% of 2019 revenues.
- Estimated Revenue loss for **2023 USD 1 billion,** 6% of 2019 revenues.
- Estimated Revenue loss for Q2 2023: USD 0.2 billion and Q3 2023: USD 0.2 billion



Number of international routes operated by African Airlines






African airlines exceeded their pre-Covid number of international routes in October 2022.

The intra-African connectivity reached 87% of the pre-Covid level during Q3 2022 and exceeded the pre-Covid level during Q4.



Share of Fifth Freedom flights - Q1 2023






- 85% of intra-African flights are direct vs 15% connecting with one-stop or more.
- Among those direct flights, 5th freedom represent only 21%, whilethe share of 3rd and 4th freedom flights is 79%

Industry initiatives to enhance Intra African connectivity



- Improving intra-African connectivity is one of AFRAA's priorities.
- To achieve this, AFRAA has taken a series of initiatives :
 - The Route Network and Cargo Committee, which objectives are stated as follows:
 - Network coordination,
 - Harmonization of flight schedules,
 - Increased intra-Africa flight frequency,
 - Synergy through collaborative network development
 - Development of virtual alliances through commercial agreements
 - Ensure that the Cargo business portfolio grows significantly
 - The AFRAA route intelligence portal;
- AFRAA is involved in joint aviation stakeholders' initiatives :
 - Collaboration with AFCAC for the implementation of the Single Air Transport Market (SAATM);
 - The Air Transport Sustainability LAB under AAIG hosted by AFRAA in June 2022;
 - The Route Development Strategy, under the AFCAN project : states, industry, airports to work together.
