

Increasing Domestic Investment in Health




Africa CDC Operating Model

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To strengthen public health surveillance systems for improved public health decisionmaking and action.


Cross border Surveillance Programme





Why Cross border Surveillance?

- Diseases know no borders.
- There is potential for rapid spread across geographic spaces particularly in regions with:
 - similar epidemiological profiles
 - socio economic drivers
 - frequent movements of people or animal carriers
- In recent years, emergence and re-emergence of infectious diseases combined with booming international trade and air travel have greatly increased disease transmission risk across borders.
- There is a global drive for all countries to strengthen mechanisms for effective cross-border surveillance and

Member State Capacity Building

Supporting Member States in Strengthening Cross-border Surveillance Information Sharing

- Support to Port Health in the MS
- Support to SADC Member States in the development of an SOP and MOU for cross border information sharing & activating of existing Border Health zones/ Committees-On going
- Enhancing of Cross Border Surveillance Information Sharing Mechanisms in the Member States
- Cross-border coordination during Public Health Emergencies or outbreaks (EOC, IMS, EMS and HIE among others)

Capacity Building (Trainings) on Enhanced Surveillance at PoEs, especially during Public Health Emergencies

- Held different PoE Trainings for COVID-19
- Participated in EAC field simulation exercise
- Developed the Enhanced Surveillance Guidelines for Ebola Sudan Virus Disease in 2022
