
Dear EACCC Members and State Focal Points,

## Summary from the states and aviation organisations

Please note that this is not a replacement for the factsheet. The information below is a short summary of current events received in the past 24 hours.

Lithuania	<p>For updated information from Lithuania, please refer to the questionnaire replies.</p>
Montenegro	<p>Taking a look at COVID 19 RELATED-NOTAMS WITH NETWORK IMPACT we have noticed that flight restriction in Montenegro is not accurately stated:</p> <p>Currently it says: All international flights prohibited; no exemptions, which is not true as only international flights with the purpose of public transport of passengers are prohibited. Cargo, repatriation, medical etc. flights are exempted from flight restriction.</p> <p>Montenegro has taken precautionary measures to protect people against the spread of COVID-19 in the country. In accordance with the orders of the Ministry of Health, the following measures are taken:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- all foreign nationals, except those with permanent or temporary residence, are prohibited to enter Montenegro,</li> <li>- 14 days of mandatory self-isolation or quarantine is introduced for all persons arriving from abroad,</li> <li>- all international flights <b>with the purpose of public transport of passengers</b> are prohibited to take off/land in Montenegro,</li> <li>- international flights with other purpose (repatriation, medical, humanitarian) can only be conducted through LYPG (Podgorica airport) with the approval of the Government of Montenegro,</li> <li>- safety directive on equipping of aircraft with Universal Precaution Kits and cleaning and disinfection of aircraft coming from specific Covid-19 affected areas is in force.</li> </ul>
Serbia	<p>Due to the development of the situation with COVID-19 new update for Serbia is given in NOTAM A 1302/20 referring to flight restrictions to all take-off/landings for international passengers air transport for all international airports in Serbia.</p> <p>Exemptions are given in NOTAM (cargo, humanitarian, MED, emergency etc. flights), too.</p>

The UK has instigated a cross Governmental coordination Team with representatives participating from aviation industry stakeholders. This facilitates regular, dynamic and contemporary coordination to advise and synchronise on appropriate actions to be taken in the aviation environment and the address operational issues.

The UK CAA has established an internal crisis management coordination team, which monitors information from a regulatory position on all aspects of UK aviation operations and is designed to escalate proportionally and in a timely manner if the threat level from the virus increases.

The UK government, responding to PHE, SAGE and other expert medical advice and evidence has increased its approach from a pure 'Containment' strategy to an enhanced 'Delay' strategy with additional measures applicable for UK citizens specifically to ensure social distancing measures. In the event of the outbreak worsening, or a severe prolonged pandemic, the response will escalate, and the focus will move from Contain and Delay, through to Mitigate.

The decision to step up the response from Contain and Delay and then Mitigate will be taken by the UK Government on advice from the PHE and UK's Chief Medical Officers, taking into account the degree of sustained transmission and evident failure of measures in other countries to reduce spread.

The UK Government will introduce emergency legislation to be used in extreme situations to Mitigate Covid-19, this will include legal powers to close UK Airports in cases where Border Force staff levels fall to a specific minimum level.

At this time the UK Foreign & Commonwealth Office (FCO) now advises British people against all non-essential travel worldwide. This advice took effect immediately on 17 March and applies initially for a period of 30 days.

Most airlines have suspended international operations, except for air ambulance, humanitarian, cargo and repatriation operations for UK citizens overseas.
