These guidelines are developed by RASG-EUR, as part of IE-REST/IE-FDG/02 deliverables.

The IE-REST Flight Data Analysis and Air Operator Safety Management System Group (IE-FDG) performed a systematization and analysis of the previously developed material in the area of continuous improvement of flight data analysis programs and creation of national fora for sharing safety data.

Based on that analysis, the IE-FDG recommended the usage of relevant documents, developed by the European Authorities Coordination Group on Flight Data Monitoring (EAFDM), as guidance material for RASG-EUR area.

RASG-EUR endorsed the proposal and hence the civil aviation authorities in RASG-EUR area are recommended to review and consider usage of the document located on the following link:
