Before the visit

- Collect information
- Interpret previous visits / audits
- Examine the filled out CAPSCA State and Airport Assistance Visit Checklist
- Respect political, economical, cultural and religious situation of the country
- Establish a visit plan

Visit

- Check national regulations and guidance material
- Interview the concerned stakeholders
- Evaluate infrastructure, material and facilities (Triage centre, PPE)
- Assess knowledge, exercises and training status of staff
- Feedback and provisional recommendations

After the visit

- Analyse the checklist
- Assess thoroughly the observations made during the visit
- Write final recommendations
- Write the visit report
- Deliver to ICAO Regional Office

COURSE BUILT-UP IN EIGHT UNITS

It is chronological in the same order as the process of a CAPSCA Technical Assistance Visit

- 1 • **Preparation** of the visit plan on the basis of preliminary information;
- 2 • **Evaluation** of :
 - 3 ➤ Public Health and Civil Aviation Authorities' national preparedness planning;
 - 4 ➤ Airport emergency planning, emergency operations centre, infrastructure and media plan;
 - 5 ➤ Planning and resources of Medical and Rescue Services;
 - 6 ➤ Knowledge and preparedness of security and handling staff;
 - 7 ➤ PH emergency procedures of the Air Navigation Service Provider, ANSP;
 - 7 ➤ PH emergency procedures at commercial Aircraft Operators;
- 8 • Ensure an accurate **Visit report** is provided to the regional ICAO/CAPSCA office.
