MULTI-CREW PILOT LICENCE (MPL) SYMPOSIUM (10 - 12 DECEMBER 2013)

SUMMARY

This information paper presents the outcome of the Multi-crew Pilot Licence (MPL) Symposium convened by ICAO in Montréal, Canada, 10 - 12 December 2013.

1. Introduction

1.1 The Multi-crew Pilot Licence (MPL) Symposium was convened by ICAO in Montréal, Canada, 10 - 12 December 2013.

2. DISCUSSION

- 2.1 The MPL is the First New ICAO Licence of its kind in over forty years. It aims at guiding students seamlessly from ab-initio training to airline type rating, using simulation designed for multi-crew training. When MPL was launched seven years ago, ICAO made a commitment to the aviation community to review the concept. As a follow-up, this event was planned with the following topics for discussion: global status of MPL implementation; MPL successes; and challenges. The main outcome was the initial identification of a work programme to improve upon the existing ICAO Standards and MPL guidance. During the symposium, ICAO presented the results of its proof-of-concept study. The symposium also provided an important experience-sharing opportunity for rule-making authorities, airlines training organizations, international organizations and other stakeholders. It included an industry exhibition of current and emerging MPL training devices and programmes.
