ICAO was created to promote the safe and orderly development of international civil aviation throughout the world. It sets standards and regulations necessary for aviation safety, security, efficiency, capacity and environmental protection.



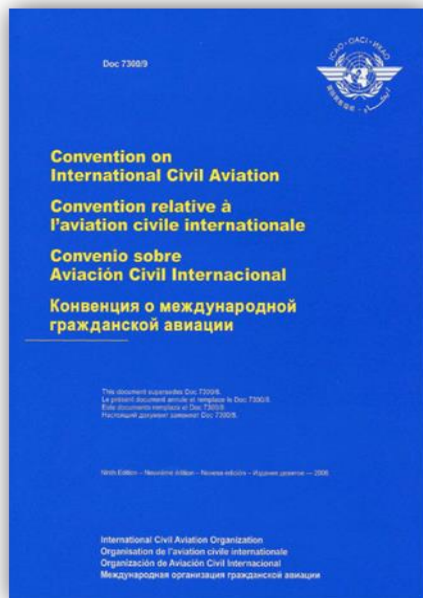
International Civil Aviation Organization

ICAO Overview – cont'd

- **Chicago Convention on International Civil Aviation (1944, 52 nations).**
 - Only global set of principles/rules governing international civil aviation.
 - One of the world's most widely accepted international treaties.
- **191 member States.**
- **19 Annexes covering all aviation disciplines, 5 PANS docs, GM.**
- **Assembly, Council – governing bodies.**
- **Air Navigation Commission – technical arm.**
- **Secretariat – development of provisions, training, implementation, and monitoring.**

Chicago Convention

The Chicago Convention, since 1944



- Government signatories
- Agreement on certain principles and arrangements
- Safe and orderly development of international civil aviation
- International air transport services based on equal opportunity and operated soundly and economically
