Sub: Exemption of Passengers and Staff from Hand Searches

With reference to the subject and in view of our concerns to fight the Corona Virus (COVID-19) outbreaks, already declared pandemic by WHO, and to align with Ministry of Health recommendations to stop the contamination spread.

Please be advised that BCAA decides to exempt Staff and passenger from Hand search and recommends to use Hand-Held Metal Detector (HHMD) instead, in order to avoid possible contamination amongst Staff, Passengers and Security Staff. To note that decision has been discussed and agreed with Mol Airport Police and this new procedure will end once the measures taken by Ministry of Health terminate.

As required by National Civil Aviation Security Programme (NCASP- Paragraph 8.1), the HHMD shall be used as secondary search to resolve both equipment alarms and people who are randomly selected by the Walk Through Metal Detector (WTMD). The primary search will remain the use of Walk Through Metal Detector (WTMD).

In view of the above, BAC is requested to coordinate with MoI Airport Police in order to provide them the sufficient number of HHMD to ensure the effective implementation of the procedure which shall be established and submitted to BCAA for approval as required by our NCASP.

Your expeditious attention and redress to this matter is highly appreciated.




