









Purpose




- Need to ensure safe and secure operations and restore public confidence

Vaccination of aircrew and ATCOs


- Recent US CDC and Israel publications show similar level of adverse reactions for the booster as for the second dose of vaccine.
- AMEs to remind all applicants of their obligations regarding decrease of medical fitness.
- → Monitoring and reporting to the CAA the adverse reactions identified in aviation personnel
- Proper booster policy is extremely important to maintain the risk of infection for aviation personnel at a low level











EU Digital COVID-19 Certificate



- The **EU Digital COVID Certificate** contains a QR code to certify if a person was vaccinated, has recovered from COVID-19 in the past 180 or was tested negative.
- → When the certificate is checked, the QR code is scanned and the signature verified.
- → Each issuing body (e.g. a hospital, a test centre, a health authority) has its own digital signature key. All of these are stored in a secure database in each country.
- The European Commission has built a gateway through which all certificate signatures can be verified across the EU. The personal data of the certificate holder does not pass through the gateway, as this is not necessary to verify the digital signature.
- → The European Commission recently recommended a booster at 6 months following complete vaccination
- To allow implementation time of the booster to the Member States the validity of the EU DCC has been limited to 9 months for the vaccinated.




EU Digital COVID-19 Certificate




- The **EU Digital COVID Certificate** is based on **freeware technology** making it easily adoptable by other States
- 25 non-EU countries (and territories) joined the EU DCC system. This includes: Albania, Andorra, Armenia, El Salvador, Faroe Islands, Georgia, Israel, Iceland, Liechtenstein, Moldova, Monaco, Morocco, New Zealand, North Macedonia, Norway, Panama, San Marino, Serbia, Singapore, Switzerland, Togo, Turkey, Ukraine, United Kingdom, The Vatican
- The European Commission also helped Member States to develop national software and apps to issue, store and verify certificates and supported them in the necessary tests to on-board the gateway.





- ★ The traffic at network level has reached its maximum on Friday 27 August 2021 with 26,773 flights (-27.7% vs 2019).
- ★ Since early September, it has slowly decreased
- ★ With the winter schedule, it has stabilized around 77% of 2019 levels.





On 24 November 2021, compared to 2019:


- ★Three segments are above 2019 levels: All-cargo (+8%), Business Aviation (+21%) and Charter (+23%) which has started to decrease since early November.
- ★ Since early November, Traditional have stabilized at -32% vs 2019 while Low-Cost, after having reached a maximum of -18% end October, have gradually decreased to reach -27% vs 2019.

Return to Normal Operations project from WS4 to Health Safety project







- → Aviation activities have resumed through normal mechanisms rulemaking, oversight, exemptions, safety promotion, etc.
- → RNO project schedule to close 1st January 2022 a Health Safety project will continue to manage the health related activities and documents.



EASA charter programme

Monitoring implementation

- → 53 airport operators (123 reporting airports) and 55 airlines have signed the Aviation Industry Charter, covering around 50% of European air traffic
- Briefing and training modules as well as checklists for Aviation Authorities inspectors on implementation monitoring have been published by EASA
- Any deficiencies are identified and signaled to the respective organisations and corrective action is requested
- The Charter as a pledge to implement the recommendations of EASA and ECDC AHSP remains ir force. But the reporting mechanism will stop.





Health Safety project

- → EASA ECDC working agreement
 - → Facilitate future collaboration
- → EASA to have access to **Epipulse** platform
 - → Allowing monitoring of outbreaks with potential impact on aviation OPS
 - → Embrace a preventive rather than reactive approach, similar to what is done for the conflict zones
- Management of SDs, SIBs, guidance material
 - → Consider duration of vaccine-induced and natural immunity
 - Gradual de-escalation strategies to mirror the risk level
 - → Medical Experts' Group sounding board for technical medical topics





Harmonisation is the key

- → Cross-domain and international harmonisation of measures
- Mutual recognition of measures
 - → EASA/ECDC AHSP means of compliance for CART in Europe
- > Avoid fraud and abuse in a coordinated manner
 - → EU Digital COVID certificates vaccination/testing/recovery
- → Research
- → Preparedness planning & Facilitation
