1. INTRODUCTION

1.1 States' CAAs should establish their national Safety enhancement Initiatives covering Aerodrome Safety to ensure the sufficient safety level for aircraft operations by establishing an oversight mechanism that can be used to measure Airport Operators safety performance. The Aerodrome Certification Process is a key mechanism guaranteeing that the current infrastructures, equipment and services are in line with the relevant ICAO SARPs and national regulations.

1.2 Runway safety remains a top priority for Aerodrome Safety and is paramount that CAAs establish a Runway Safety Programme to address the issues related to Aerodrome Design and Operations. ICAO promote the implementation of the Local Runway Safety Teams and emphasises on the important role of such mechanism to proactively manage runway safety issues.

1.3 ICAO Runway Safety Partners (RSP) identified Runway Excursion as the runway safety Highest Risk Category (HRC) considering the fact that the main contributory factor leading to runways' excursions is contaminated runway. As part of the mitigation measures proposed by ICAO, the Global Reporting Format (GRF) methodology is providing the actions needed to effectively assess and report runways conditions therefore assuring sufficient safety for Aircraft take-off and landing operations.
