ICAO LANGUAGE PROFICIENCY REQUIREMENTS

SUMMARY

The new language proficiency requirements in Annexes 1, 6, 10, and 11 have been applicable since 27 November 2003. The purpose of this paper is to provide you with information on this subject that can be of use in the CAR Region.

1. Guidance Material

1.1 A manual is in preparation and should be completed in the Air Navigation Bureau in early 2004. In the meantime, ICAO has created a section on language proficiency requirements in the Frequent Question of the ICAO Web site (See http://www.icao.int/icao/en/trivia/peltrgFAQ.htm#q9).

2. Symposium

- 2.1 ICAO is planning a worldwide symposium to be held at ICAO Headquarters from 1 to 3 September 2004. The tentative agenda is attached in the **Appendix** to this paper. The target population for the Symposium are senior management, technical and training personnel from civil aviation authorities, airlines, training organizations and air traffic service providers. The language training and testing providers are expected to be interested. The objective of the symposium is to provide the participants with practical information on the ICAO provisions on language competency and the possible response for the implementation of the provisions in their States and organizations. A particular emphasis will be given to the ways of assessing the quality and appropriateness of the training and testing solutions that will, undoubtedly be proposed by the language training industry.
- 2.2 The plan is to offer the Symposium free of charge for participants from Civil Aviation Authorities, but to charge a registration fee (likely around 250US\$) for the participants coming from the industry. However this point still needs to be approved by the President.
- 2.3 The official letter of invitation should be sent in early 2004.

3. Regional Seminars

Regional seminars will be organized after the Symposium with a special emphasis on the parts of the world where the implementation of the new Standards is likely to be more difficult (Northern Asia, CIS States, Latin America, French and Portuguese speaking Africa). There is not a specific budget to support the seminar and thus, the funding options are SIP, miscellaneous income and/or hosting by sponsoring States and Organization.
