- Service providers to establish performance management systems
- Key Performance Areas (KPAs):
 - Safety
 - Quality of service
 - Productivity
 - Cost-effectiveness



CEANS Recommendation #2: Economic Performance (cont)

- Guidance in the economics manuals (under review)
- Airports: Doc 9562, Chapter 3, Section C Means of measuring performance and productivity (paragraphs 3.85-3.105)
- Air navigation: Doc 9161, Chapter 4,
 Section C Means of measuring performance and productivity (paragraphs 4.82-4.126)



A practical example: ATM performance in Europe

Performance Review Commission (PRC)

- The PRC provides independent advice on European Air Traffic Management (ATM) Performance to the EUROCONTROL Commission, through the Provisional Council
- Objective: "to introduce a strong, transparent and independent performance review and target setting system to facilitate more effective management of the European ATM system, encourage mutual accountability for system performance"



A practical example: ATM performance in Europe (cont)

Performance Review Report

EUROCONTROL Member States

- Unit costs: down
- Traffic forecasts: decrease
- Objective: ANSPs to adjust plans



Economic performance and minimum reporting requirements

Requirements for performance management systems

- Reliable and appropriate data
- Realistic, achievable objectives
- Transparency is fundamental
