AERODROME CERTIFICATION AND EMERGENCY PLANS

(Presented by the Secretariat)

SUMMARY

This working paper presents the implementation status summary for aerodrome certification and safety management systems, as well as the overall situation regarding emergency plans and emergency operations centres (EOC) in the NAM/CAR States/Territories.

1. Introduction

1.1 GREPECAS, through its AGA/AOP Subgroup, has followed-up on the implementation of aerodrome certification in the CAR/SAM Regions in accordance with the standards and recommended practices (SARPs) contained in Annex 14, Volume I, which establishes that States should certify, within a proper regulatory framework, aerodromes used for international operations, and that certified aerodrome operators implement safety management systems (SMS). In addition, the document specifies that States must establish an emergency plan at each aerodrome considering aircraft operations and other activities developed at the aerodrome, and that a fixed emergency operations centre should be established to handle emergency situations at each aerodrome.

1.2 The ICAO NACC Regional Office, together with States and Territories in the Region, have developed a series of initiatives aligned with the strategic objectives of ICAO. Following-up on strategic objectives implies a joint effort to consolidate and operate, in an optimum scenario and in a short period of time, the development of air operations, which integrate the Global Air Navigation Plan (Doc 9750 AN/963). A follow-up activity summary related to the abovementioned topics are described in the following paragraphs.

2. Discussion

- 2.1 The surveys carried out and presented in previous Meetings of the AGA/AOP/SG indicated the progress made by States/Territories with basic legislation and implementation of aerodrome certification from a general point of view. States/Territories were requested to objectively provide the status of certification progress at each of their aerodromes in order to identify possible specialized training needs, support from the ICAO Technical Co-operation Bureau or other necessary aspects to comply with related ICAO SARPs.
- 2.2 The same initiative from the previous paragraph was undertaken regarding safety management systems, which occurred after the preparation of the Safety Management Manual (SMM) (Doc 9859).
- 2.3 The results of the surveys provided by NACC States/Territories regarding certification of aerodromes are presented in Tables 1 and 2 of **Appendix A** to this working paper. Likewise, the progress made with implementation of basic documentation and the implementation of SMS is contained in Tables 1 and 2, respectively, of **Appendix B**. Unfortunately, some States did not reply to this survey; it has been assumed that the lack of response is due to non-implementation of these standards at the corresponding international aerodromes.
- 2.4 Regarding emergency plans, the regular missions conducted by ICAO to States/Territories showed problems with compliance of minimum requirements for both emergency plans as well as the implementation of emergency operations centres (EOCs).
- 2.5 In this regard, problems observed during regular missions and State/Territory survey results identify the lack of awareness regarding the effects of emergency plans and EOCs to aircraft/aerodrome safety, the absence of emergency plans or lack of updates, the absence of full-scale or partial aerodrome emergency exercises, the lack of partial exercises one year after a full-scale exercise in order to correct observed deficiencies, the lack of implementation of an EOC and the lack of exercises at these centres. The main results of the surveys sent to States/Territories are presented in **Appendix C** to this working paper.
- At the DGAC/CAP/93 Meeting held this past July, States agreed to review and update the information contained in Appendices A, B and C regarding certification of aerodromes, implementation of SMS and EOCs, respectively, for receipt by the ICAO NACC Regional Office no later than **15 August 2008**. It is highlighted that the deadline has passed and no responses have been received to date. This considered, **Appendix D** contains tables to update/report this information. In addition, this information has been posted on the Regional Office website for action. States/Territories need to complete the requested information for receipt by the Regional Office no later than **10 October 2008**. If no reply is received from your Administration by this date, it will be assumed that your State/Territory is not in compliance with the associated standards.

- 2.7 In compliance with GREPECAS Conclusion 14/29, the Meeting is also hereby informed of the Airport Emergency Plans and Emergency Operations Centre Seminar/Workshop for the North American, Central American and Caribbean Regions (NAM/CAR) to be held from 29 September to 3 October 2008, in Tortola, British Virgin Islands. Further information on the event can be obtained in **Appendix E** to this paper.
- 2.8 Also, in compliance with Conclusion 92/2 of the DGAC/CAP/92 Meeting, an Aerodromes Certification Seminar/Workshop will be conducted at the COCESNA ICCAE facilities in 2009

3. Recommendations

- 3.1 The Meeting is invited to:
 - a) take note, review, comment and update the information contained in the different Appendices;
 - b) forward the information requested in paragraph 2.6 to the ICAO NACC Office before 10 October 2008;
 - c) consider the actions required by ICAO in order that States proceed with the certification of their corresponding international aerodromes and implement safety management systems; and
 - d) indicate the need for specific additional aerodrome emergency training and correct implementation of emergency plans at international airports.

Presentations will be made by specialists from the United States and ICAO, as well as States and concerned international organizations who wish to share their experiences with the subject. The event will include the following:

- Importance of emergency planning;
- Types of Emergencies;
- Agencies involved and role of each agency;
- Contents and development of AEP;
- Communication, emergency operations centre and mobile command post;
- Medical emergencies facilities;
- Special rescue and support equipment;
- Fire fighting facilities and services;
- Disabled aircraft removal:
- Mutual aid emergency agreements;
- Emergencies related to aircraft accidents on or off the airport;
- Emergencies related to natural disasters;
- Experience in handling emergencies at airports near water; and
- Public information and handling of the media during emergencies.

As soon as we establish the final programme for the seminar/workshop, it will be forwarded to your Administration accordingly.

The working language of the seminar/workshop will be **English**. Registration forms should be completed and returned to this Regional Office as soon as possible. Participants are requested to make their own accommodation, travel and visa arrangements. However, any difficulties with accommodation or visas may be forwarded to this Regional Office. Please note that the registration fees are waived for participants representing government entities from ICAO Contracting States and Territories of the NAM/CAR Regions as well as those representing International Organizations.
