Facilitating the air traveller journey  This session is intended to review the facilitation processes and the border control formalities with the aim of reducing congestion at departure control points and in the interests of improving facilitation by streamlining traffic flows. The session will discuss proposed unified and safe strategies for worldwide implementation leading to the rationalization of the processing of passengers and crews during their journey. There is a need for continuing action by Member States to improve the effectiveness and efficiency of clearance control formalities and the establishment and active operation of national air transport facilitation programmes and facilitation committees is a proven means of effecting needed improvements. International cooperation on facilitation and coordination with the various national and regional parties and industry stakeholder has substantially improved the passenger experience.

Accessibility in International Civil Aviation  Facilitation of the transport of persons with disabilities is a major challenge for air transport facilitation as a significant and expanding portion of the global population comprises persons with disabilities and reduced mobility. As a result, it is becoming increasingly important to render accessibility in aviation for all passengers worldwide, particularly those most vulnerable, such as those with disabilities. However, certain barriers prevent elderly and disabled persons from utilizing international air transportation services to their full potential. These obstacles include varying requirements throughout the passenger journey. The Summit will discuss how to develop an effective ICAO strategy on accessibility for passengers with disabilities and reduced mobility in order to reach for a disability-inclusive air transport system in cooperation with all the stakeholders. This session will build on the actions identified in the Assembly Resolution A41-15, related to Accessibility.

Benefits of Innovation on the future air traveller's journey  This session will consider the different areas of innovation in air transport Facilitation and their impact on the typical future traveler's journey. Member States that have experience in facilitating the introduction of innovation in civil aviation, and that have evolved their regulatory methods to better evaluate and assess the application of such innovations, will be encouraged to share their experience with other States through ICAO. Consideration will notably be given to innovative digital systems and tools allowing seamless, contactless, quicker and more efficient cross-border processes from departure to arrival in an airport. The discussion will highlight both the need for agility of stakeholders in incorporating new data in the processes when necessary and the key role of interoperability in the implementation of seamless and contactless solutions.
