It necessitates contingency planning, operational management and emergency response for use both during routine operations and emergency situations. As such, mechanisms are required in terms of capacity building, disinsection and disinfection requirements for aircraft and airports, and supporting aviation personnel and passengers to not only mitigate the spread of contagious diseases by air, but to also minimize the potential adverse impact of public health events (disease and non-disease related) on the aviation sector.
