

North Runway



Year	Development
1970' s	County Development Plans safeguard for Parallel Runway
2005	Planning application lodged.
2007	Permission granted with 31 Conditions
2008	Passenger numbers reach 23.4m
2009	Project put on hold due to Recession
2010	Passenger numbers down 5m in 2 years
2015	Growth of 15%: Passenger numbers reach 25m.
2016	National Aviation Policy endorses runway project.
2016	Decision to proceed with North Runway under existing permission

Two planning conditions are onerous:


- No use of North Runway between 2300 and 0700.
- 65 ATM between 2300 and 0700.



Changing noise regime since permission was granted in 2007

- 3rd Noise Action Plan shows greater numbers affected by noise
- Increased public concern in relation to noise
- Regulation 598/2014 (Balanced Approach); new Competent Authority for airport noise announced
- New World Health Organisation (WHO) Guidelines for Night Noise released














Community Fund




The Fund, launched in 2017, consists of an annual investment of €400,000 over 25 years. This means a total €10 million investment in local communities by the airport over the course of the funding period.

Over €1 million has been invested in community projects since the fund launched in June 2017.

What I have learned (so far!) with Community Engagement and noise

- Have the technical information available but do not focus too much on noise contours as most people don't understand them! Focus on information such as the number and times of flights, likely flight paths, future aircraft types
- Go to the community but If possible, avoid 'town hall' meetings
- If possible have 'face to face' contact but stay calm and never 'lose your cool'.



- 'Non-acoustic' factors are very important.
- Be aware that historical grievances may be part of the reaction to new developments. What is the history of the airport and that community?
- Fear of the unknown is significant factor. Correct mistruths or 'rumours' that lead to these fears
- Support as many community groups, sports clubs, educational facilities as you can = emphasise the positive impact of the airport
- Clearly explain your mitigation proposals and the likely impacts
- Share information about major airport plans in a timely manner and not just in 'development' phases or 'when the airports wants something'
