

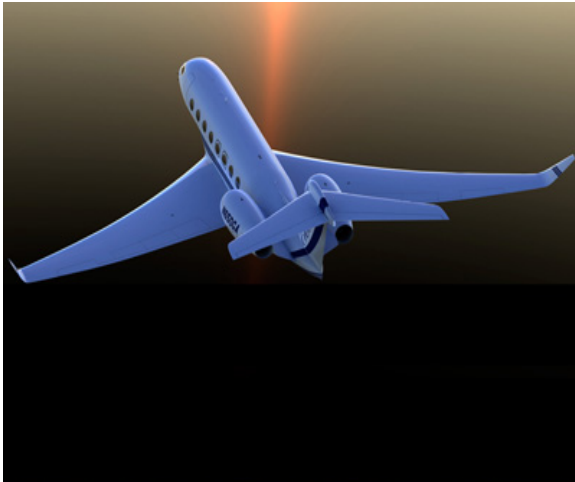


Reducing runway safety accidents

- Business aviation includes commercial air taxi, and non-commercial corporate, fractional and owner-operated.
- Point-to-point, most direct, fuel-efficient routes
- Departure times based on specific requirement
- Use of large number of operating locations
 - Secondary Airports
- Wide spectrum of aircraft types – From Single –engine, propeller driven to high performance Jets.
 - Single pilot and Multi-crew operation

 - Industry standards

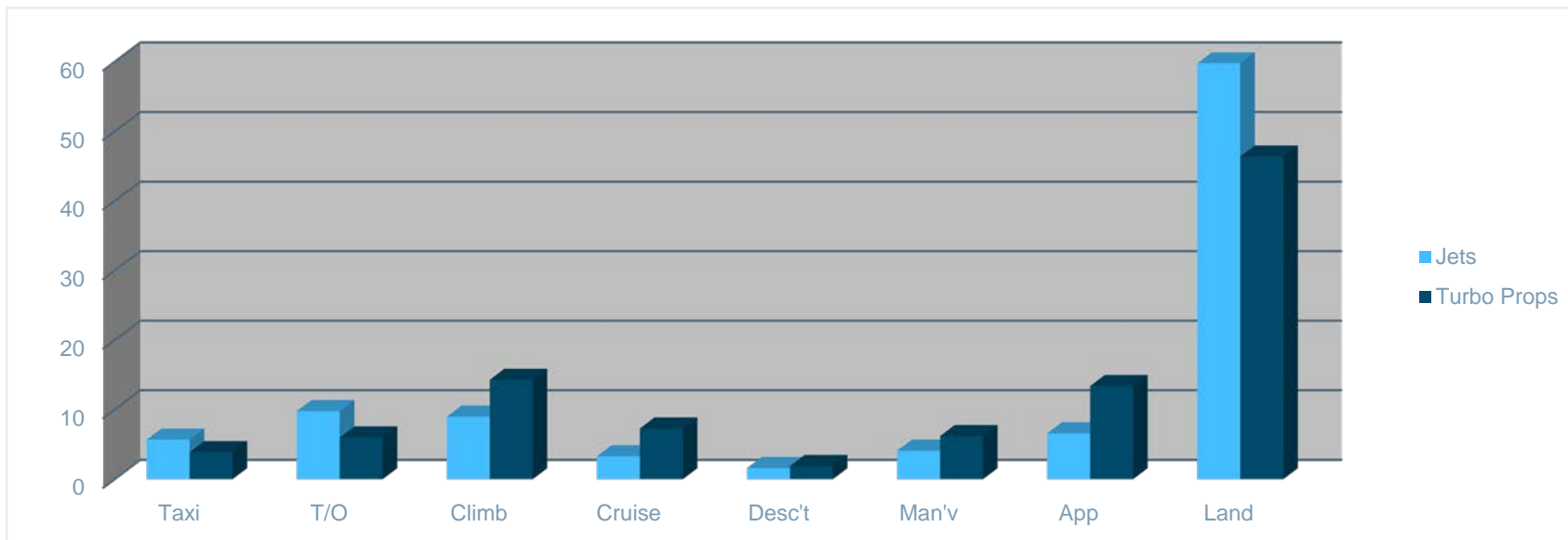
BA Accidents- by phase of flight

Five year totals ending 2015



Accident Summary by Phase of Flight

	Taxi	T/O	Climb	Cruise	Desc't	Man'v	App	Land	Total
Business Jets	7 5.7%	14 11.4%	12 9.8%	4 3.3%	2 1.6%	4 3.3%	10 8.1%	70 56.9%	123 100%
Turbo Props	13 3.9%	20 6.0%	48 14.3%	27 8.1%	5 1.5%	20 6.0%	47 14.0%	155 46.3%	335 100%



- Runway length was seldom a factor.
- Fatigue did not appear as an issue.
- Pilot experience was not an evident problem,
- Low ceilings and visibility not prevalent.
- Day/night not a factor.

- Poor speed control and unstable approaches most prevalent cause.
- Incorrect or lack of reported runway conditions were a frequent factor.
- Crosswind and gusts were also frequent.
- Poor runway conditions and snow clearance frequent factors

- Runway Status Lights
- Improved runway condition reporting
 - TALPA
- Accelerate implementation of vertical guidance approaches
- Improve data collection
- SMS implementation
