Global Cargo Hub to Key Trade Lanes


Strategically Connected

9.5 Hours from 90% of the Industrialize World

The Ted Stevens Anchorage International Airport is strategically positioned as a Global Hub, connecting major cities in Asia, the United States, and Europe. Anchorage provides the level of international access that a modern business requires to succeed.

- ANC is the 5th Largest Cargo Airport in the World, 2nd in the U.S.
- Over 500 Widebody Landings per week.

Unique Cargo Transfer Opportunities

- Alaska offers international air carriers unique opportunities to operate a flexible and efficient system of air cargo services
- In 2003 the US Congress passed a law granting a limited exception to the cabotage prohibition for certain cargo operations at Alaska
- Eligible cargo taken on or off in Alaska is not deemed to have broken its international journey allowing interline between non-US carriers (49 U.S.C. § 41701 Navigation of foreign civil aircraft)
- On-Line Transfers: No Restrictions
- Interline To/From US: A foreign flag carrier <u>can</u> carry cargo on domestic US segment (in either direction) if (a) under a US carrier code (e.g., UA) or for a US Indirect air carrier (a freight forwarder) and (b) connection is in Alaska
- Comingling Non-US Cargo with US Cargo
- Transferring Non-US cargo in Alaska: No Restrictions
- Change-of-gauge (including "starburst")

另外的DOT豁免权限 Special U.S. DOT exemption authority

在最初豁免权之外的另外的权限,允许拥有美国DOT营运资格的国外承运人,也同时拥有在阿拉斯加运营的权力,并且也 拥有以阿拉斯加为经停站和美国任意城市之间做两个城市之间的转运权力。这个权限也对客运航班适用 美国交通部欢迎国外承运人申请超过双边协议其它的美国城市,这些额外的服务点也将同时享有服务阿拉斯加的权限 *The U.S. Department of Transportation has invited foreign air carriers to apply for authority to serve additional U.S. points on an extra-bilateral basis where those additional U.S. points would be served on flights also serving Alaska.*



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Alaska-Canada Highway






 Air-Sea connections to/from Anchorage-Seattle



- Includes 75-mile Bering Strait tunnel









Intercontinental Railroad


- Connect rich Alaska resources to population centers and lower 48 states
