Focus:


- > Facilitate regulatory reform for sustainable economic development




Regulatory Developments

Over 400 Open Skies Agreements involving 146 States





ICAO Long-term Vision for Liberalization

(Assembly Resolution A39-15)


"We, the Member States of the International Civil Aviation Organization, resolve to actively pursue the continuous liberalization of international air transport to the benefit of all stakeholders and the economy at large.

We will be guided by the need to ensure respect for the highest levels of safety and security and the principle of fair and equal opportunity for all States and their stakeholders".

Core Principles on Consumer Protection

(Assembly Resolution A39-15)

- A living document, aimed at providing guidance to States and industry stakeholders; fostering convergence and compatibility

Disseminated to States/stakeholders

States to apply and Provide feedback

Provide feedback

ICAO to promote implementation and monitor developments



Core Principles

Guidance available on ICAO website, covering:

Before the travel

Balance passenger rights/industry competitiveness

Pre-travel information, including price transparency

During the travel

Assistance/compensation, as provided by regulations or contract

Coordination between stakeholders to address "massive disruptions"

After the Travel

Efficient complaint handling procedures

Further work: (i) definition of "massive disruptions"; and (ii) principle of proportionality.

WORK IN PROGRESS





Develop international agreements for liberalization

- Covering: Market access, Air cargo, and Air carrier ownership and control, for Willing and Ready States
- Drafts being developed by ATRP (WG)
- Process: prepare draft text; consult States; report to governing bodies; finalize agreement; States to sign

Address issues: competition and safeguards

- Liberalization to be accompanied with safeguards
- Issues: Application of competition laws; Fair competition; State aid/subsidies; Labour concerns; Essential services
- Examined by ATConf/6, and ATRP/12, ATRP/13 meetings

ICAO's work:

- Compendium on States competition policies and practice to help transparency (available on ICAO website)
- States encouraged to provide input to the Compendium
- Forum for exchanges (e.g. ICANs, IATS2016)
- Safeguard provisions being considered by ATRP in the context of international agreements for liberalization
- Monitor developments and update guidance material





ICAO'S SUPPORT AND ASSISTANCE





- Facilitate liberalization

- Promote dialogue, exchange of information and ideas through conferences and other meetings
