Outcomes of the 41st ICAO Assembly– setting the tone for the future

The 41st ICAO Assembly (A41) addressed major issues faced by the aviation industry. Certain key decisions of this Assembly will have a significant impact on international civil aviation such as the adoption of a long-term global aspirational goal for net zero carbon emissions by 2050 (LTAG) and the call for adherence to the rule of law including compliance with the Chicago Convention. The Assembly also formally commemorated the contributions of the Legal Committee to air law over the past 75 years and confirmed its work programme. Speakers will highlight and elaborate on these key decisions of the Assembly and how they will guide the work of the organization in the legal field, enabling participants to consider the impact of the decisions on their work and for the future of air law.

Mechanisms of the Chicago Convention

14:00-14:45: Part 1

The ICAO Council and Settlement of Differences between States.

The last decade has seen an increase in the number of aviation disputes between States submitted to the ICAO Council for settlement. While there were six disputes filed in the first 70 years of the existence of the Article 84 mechanism in the Chicago Convention, a further four disputes have been submitted in the last six years. As States increasingly look to the Council for the resolution of aviation disputes, the modernisation of the ICAO Rules for the Settlement of Differences is both relevant and timely. Is the Council a judicial body, a quasi judicial body, or a political or diplomatic body or a hybrid body? This session will feature a conversation among the Panellists on these and other important questions.

Using ICAO's enhanced tools for the implementation of Article 83bis to address potential aviation safety risks.

The lease, charter and interchange of aircraft play a significant role in the provision of international air services. Nevertheless, such arrangements present oversight challenges when the result is that the State of the Operator is not the State of Registry. The use of Article 83 bis (in transferring certain oversight responsibilities) assists in countering potential safety risks resulting from split oversight responsibilities. Tools have been developed by ICAO to help States in implementing Article 83 bis. Panellists will address questions such as: When is it appropriate to enter into an Article 83 bis agreement and what oversight responsibilities can it cover? What guidance is available on the implementation of Article 83 bis? How can an Article 83 bis agreement be registered with ICAO? Where can information on registered Article 83 bis agreements be found? The key features and experiences of using the ICAO Website of Aeronautical Agreements and Arrangements will also be presented.

Crisis management for legal advisers: Supporting the COVID- 19 Pandemic response and air travel recovery

The COVID-19 pandemic decimated air travel, requiring urgent health, safety, operational and financial related actions, including the application of public health risk mitigation measures. These unmasked various unprecedented legal issues and exacerbated existing ones. Data privacy in the use of passenger information for air travel health data, use of regulatory alleviations through the COVID-19 Contingency Related Differences (CCRDs) and Targeted Exemptions (TEs,) the implementation of arrangements to establish Public Health Corridors and enforcement actions to address the escalation of unruly and disruptive passenger incidents are examples of such issues. Innovative legal solutions enabled continued compliance with air law requirements such as SARPs and regulatory requirements rendered impracticable by the pandemic. ICAO's Civil Aviation Recovery Task Force



(CART) enabled a global approach to the application of facilitation, safety, medical and other guidance which was crucial to maintain air connectivity and protect the health and safety of crew and passengers during the pandemic. The speakers and panellists will share their recollections and perspectives on the key moments and issues during the pandemic when legal interventions were critical or useful, the legal responses and solutions to the crisis situation as it evolved; their impact, the lessons learnt and what the future holds for air law and the legal advisers' role in crisis management.
