SUMMARY

This paper presents the administrative arrangements for the Eleventh Session of the Statistics Division (STA/11).

1. **INTRODUCTION**

- 1.1 The Tenth Session of the Statistics Division Meeting (STA/10) was held in 2009. Since then, aviation has experienced data transformation with velocity and quantity of data growing and new technologies evolving to analyze such data. The ICAO work programme in this field continued to be adjusted and modernized with a shift of focus towards more robust aviation data and analysis for informed decision-making by States in tandem of the technological advancement.
- 1.2 This paper describes the organizational arrangements for the Eleventh Session of the Statistics Division (STA/11). They are in addition to the *Standing Rules of Procedure for Meetings in the Air Transport Field* (Doc 8683).
- 1.3 The meeting will consider the recommendations of the Third Meeting of the Aviation Data and Analysis Panel (ADAP/3) on its activities, ranging from data quality and reporting, collaboration with the United Nations (UN) and other international organizations, big data analysis, aviation satellite account framework, post-COVID-19 traffic forecasts, forecasts of licensed aviation personnel, and global aviation competitiveness index.

2. **WORK PROGRAMME**

2.1 The meeting will work as one body to deal with all agenda items. The agenda is attached in Appendix A to this paper.

Agenda Item 1: ICAO Air Transport Reporting Forms

The Division will consider the further modernization of the ICAO Statistics Programme and the methodology developed by the Secretariat for completing non-reported data sets and their conformity to the United Nations Statistical Commission (UNSC) guidelines for filling data gaps. The Division will also consider the ADAP/3 recommendations on: a) continuing the collection of fuel consumption data under Air Transport Reporting Form M; b) collection of licensed aviation personnel by gender through a survey; c) collaboration with the Secretariat Study Group on Cybersecurity (SSGC) to examine the possible data collection of cybersecurity incidents; and d) analysis of the impacts of clarifying the statistical definition of the non-scheduled all cargo traffic.

Agenda Item 2: Big data analytics

The Division will consider: a) ADAP/3 recommendations on ICAO's work in using big data for contact tracing of passengers during public health emergencies; and b) on-going provision of big data to support the work of Member States and the Committee on Aviation Environmental Protection (CAEP). The Division will provide guidance on the integration of big data and computing technologies into the aviation data and analysis work programme so as to better meet the requirements for evidenced-based decision making by States.

Agenda Item 3: Long-term air traffic forecasts

The Division will review the post-COVID-19 forecasts scenarios that were presented to the ADAP/3 and decide on the frequency of updates to ICAO long-term traffic forecasts to assist States and aviation stakeholders in their post COVID-19 planning and implementation needs.

Agenda item 4: Aviation Satellite Account (ASA) methodological framework

The Division will consider: a) the proposed methodological framework of ASA for the economic measurement of aviation activity; b) the impact of the inclusion of aircraft manufacturing in the scope of measurement of civil aviation's contribution to the gross domestic product (GDP) of Member States; and c) reconciliation of the methodology with existing aviation economic data and studies. The Division will also consider a proposal to arrive at the economic contribution of civil aviation using the ASA methodological framework for evidenced-based policymaking by States.

Agenda item 5: Report of the on-going analytical projects

The Division will consider ADAP/3 recommendations on the on-going analytical projects with: a) the United Nations on e-commerce; b) the Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD) on the System of Environmental-Economic Accounting (SEEA); and c) the Universal Postal Union (UPU) on international logistics constraints for e-commerce. The Division will also consider the progress of the Aviation Competitiveness Index Working Group (ACWG) established under ADAP/3, tasked with the development of methodologies and data sources for arriving at a global aviation competitiveness index.
