



The International Civil Aviation Organization (ICAO) is a United Nations agency which helps the governments of the world to share the sky to their mutual benefit. ICAO supports States in their development of consensus-based global civil aviation standards and recommended practices which are adopted into the Annexes of the Convention on International Civil Aviation (Chicago Convention), a multilateral air transport legal agreement drafted in 1944 and presently adhered to by 193 countries.

Taking advantage of the central position this role affords it in global civil aviation affairs, ICAO also produces global planning targets to align worldwide progress in areas such as aviation safety, air navigation capacity and efficiency, and aviation security. It supports these plans with direct regional coordination, assistance, and capacity building, and ultimately helps governments to recognize how well-resourced and ICAO-compliant aviation connectivity can deliver dependable and sustainable socio-economic benefits to their citizens and businesses.







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
