The Sixth Edition of the Global Air Navigation Plan (GANP) introduced the concept of Basic Building Blocks (BBB) and the ICAO Assembly has called for the implementation verification of essential services to be provided for international civil aviation, as is the case of the volcano watch in international airways. In the same way, amendment 79 to Annex 3 recommended to strengthen the harmonization of information provided in the advisory of Information concerning en-route weather phenomena which may affect the safety of aircraft operations (SIGMET).

Therefore, I am pleased to invite your State/Administration/Organization to participate in the Webinar on mechanisms to improve the coordination of information concerning en-route weather phenomena and updates from the Volcanic Ash Warning Center (VAAC), which will take place online through the Zoom videoconference platform, on 7 December 2021, from 11:00 am EST (16:00 GMT) to 2:00 pm EST (19:00 GMT). The Webinar will be in English with simultaneous interpretation provided by the ICAO South American Regional Office (SAM).
