


EU – EASA aviation safety System

Performs standardisation inspections on behalf of Commission

Manages EPAS (European Plan for Aviation Safety)

Coordinates SAFA programme

Coordination on security with FC





NAA- National Aviation Authorities

Issue most certificates, approvals & licences under EU-EASA rules Oversee organisations Implement EU law **Conduct Ramp inspections**



Oversees the implementation of common rules by Member States, including the safeguard and flexibility provisions

Manages Safety List

Negotiates international agreements





Mission in aviation as RSOO









Ensure the highest common level of aviation safety and environmental protection within the EU and worldwide in support of ICAO

Ensure safe and sustainable connectivity between Europe and LAC in support of the Aviation Authorities and Industry

Assist during COVID19 by facilitating a regional approach for the benefit of connectivity between regions (e.g. EASA/ECDC Health Safety Protocol, accepted as regional means of compliance)

COVID-19 showed that RSOOs like EASA can also support States in managing the crisis by allocating resources or taking over certain tasks



EASA Support in NAM/CAR of the RSOO

EU-EASA Aviation Partnership Project in LAC

From: 1st June 2022 until 31st May 2025

Partners: Argentina, Brazil, Chile, Colombia, Mexico, Dominican Republic, Panama, SRVSOP, CASSOS, ACSA

Under EU-LAC APP, EASA, being the unique level 3 RSOO, has:

- Promoted its standardisation philosophy
- ✓ Supported harmonisation processes
- ✓ Implemented in several domain specific activities to the success of the regional initiatives

Assessment of CASSOS organisation to become an ICAO recognised RSOO. Cooperation activities were developed and implemented, such as the Regional workshop for ADR certification, providing a harmonised approach for the region.

Assessment of ACSA and Central American set of operations regulations to promote a common certification and acceptance process for aviation operators (MRAC OPS 1)

Efforts made for Central American States to implement a common process for acceptance and publication of aviation regulations (RAC 11).

Proposals for establishing a unique harmonised process for Regional ANSP certification in Central America.



Regional Aviation Safety

Concrete actions through OJTs, workshops, meetings, webinars Re-enforce standardisation programme and support its implementation

Provide training on aviation concepts and regulations, based on EU/EASA regulations

Support ACSA and CASSOS vis-à-vis in their roadmap to become consolidated RSOOs

Cooperate with SRVSOP in promoting international standards and concepts, relevant for the region
