Agenda Item 1: Adoption of the Provisional Agenda and Schedule

1.1 The Secretariat presented WP/01 and invited the Meeting to approve the Provisional Agenda and Schedule. The Meeting approved the Agenda and the Schedule as presented.

Agenda Item 2: Discussion on the Results of the Surveys, Work Done and Scheduled for the Immediate Future

- 2.1 Under this Agenda Item, the Meeting followed up on the previous conclusions/decisions of the NCMC/WG and the Directors General mandates, as well as the results of the survey sent to the States. These results mainly point to the lack of:
 - a) technical personnel in the authorities;
 - b) specialized and continued training in general;
 - c) training in the Online Framework (OLF); and
 - d) understanding and depth of the ICAO Protocol Questions (PQs).
- 2.2 Taking into consideration the results of the survey, the NCMC/WG proposed the establishment of Task Forces to develop a compliant model training programme, and enrichment of the Universal Safety Oversight Audit Programme (USOAP) Continuous Monitoring Approach (CMA) Workshop material in order to update it with information affecting the NAM/CAR Regions, to provide this improved workshop to the personnel of the States. In addition, the NCMC/WG presented a methodology for the detection of personnel needs in the Civil Aviation Authorities with enhanced criteria to improve the evaluation of the personnel needed by the States, which is already available on the NACC Regional Office webpage. In this sense, the Meeting proposed the following Draft Conclusion:

7.1 Under this Agenda Item the Secretariat presented the Flight Simulation Training Device (FSTD) Certification Guidance Document, developed with the participation of International Organizations and SAP "Champion States", such as United States, Latin American and Caribbean Air Transport Association (ALTA), Central American Corporation for Air Navigation Services (COCESNA), European Aviation Safety Agency (EASA), and the Regional Safety Oversight Cooperation System (SRVSOP).
