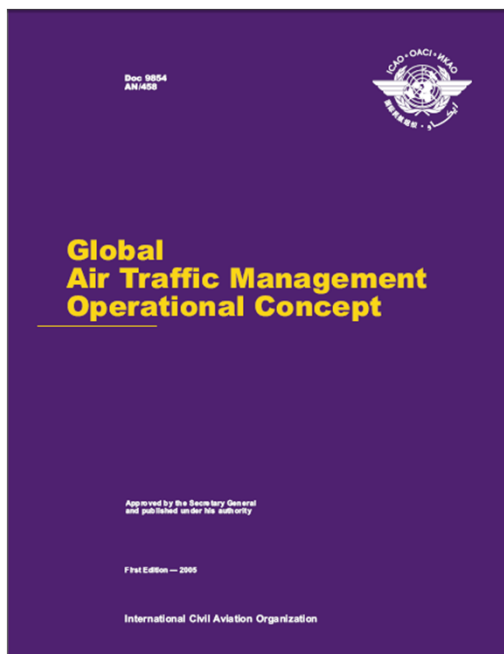

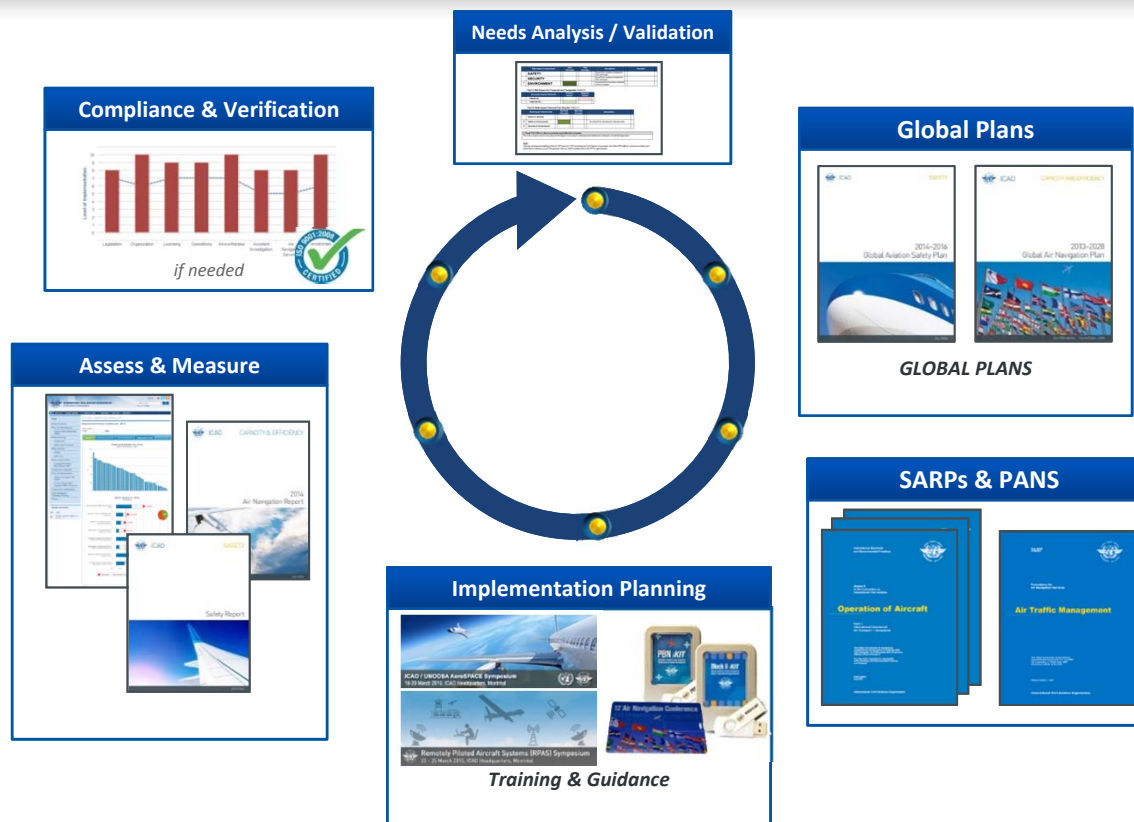

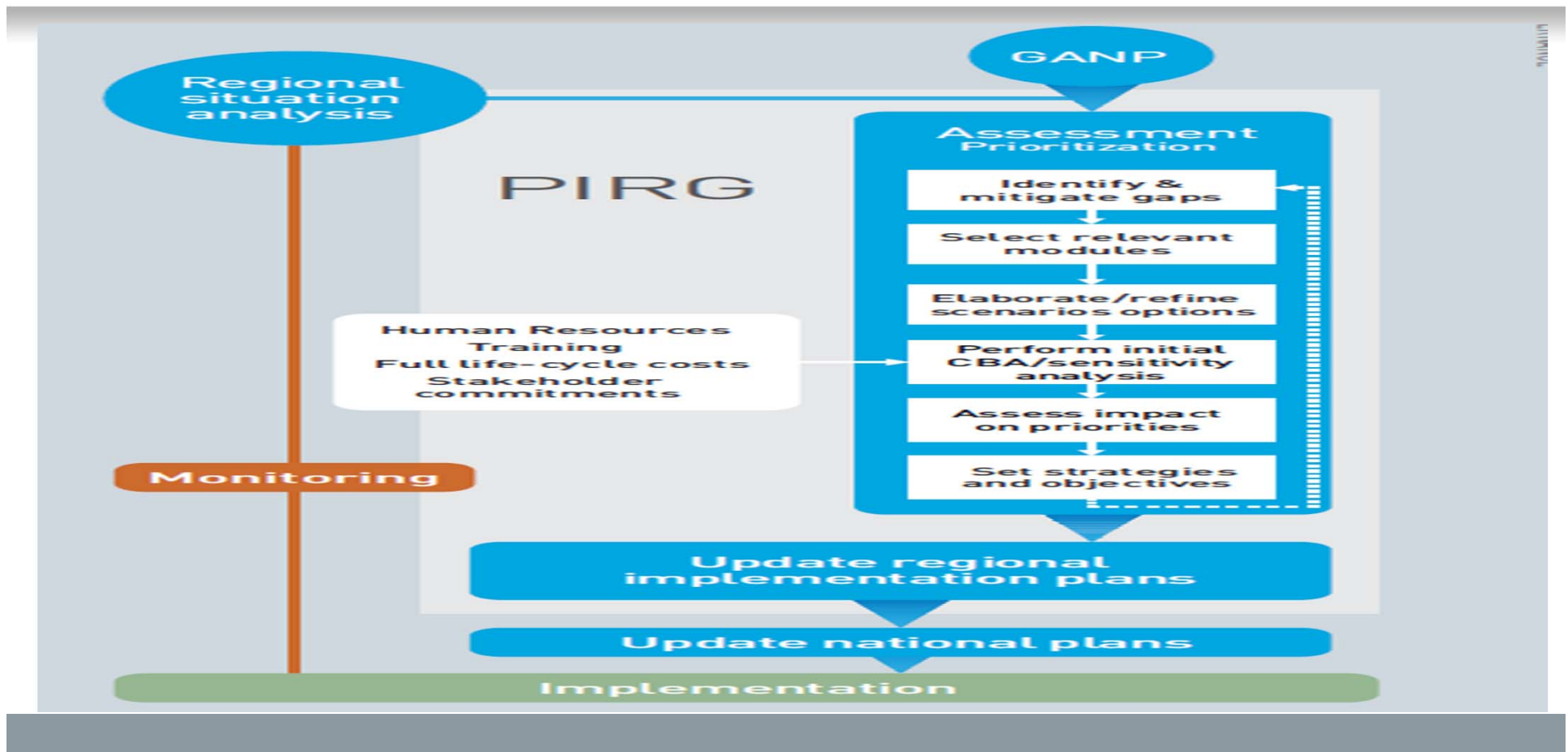
GANP's Role

- Through the **Aviation System Block Upgrades (ASBU)**, provide a consensus-driven modernization strategy for integrated planning based on performance

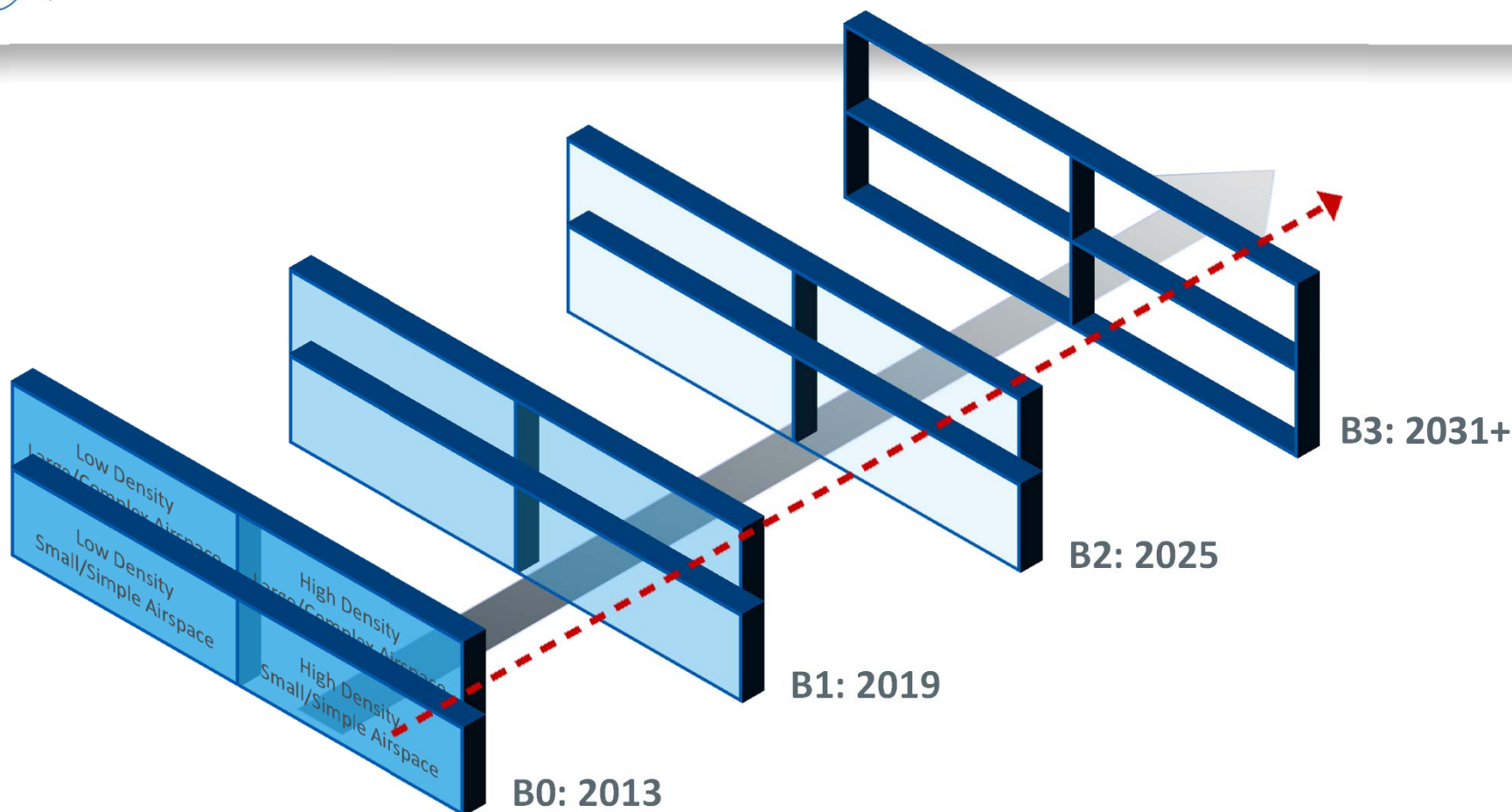

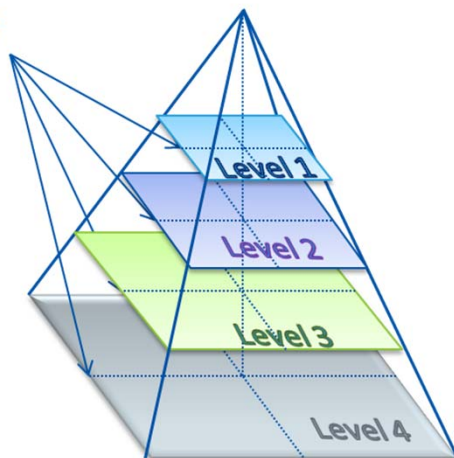

- Defines a set of elements from different threads

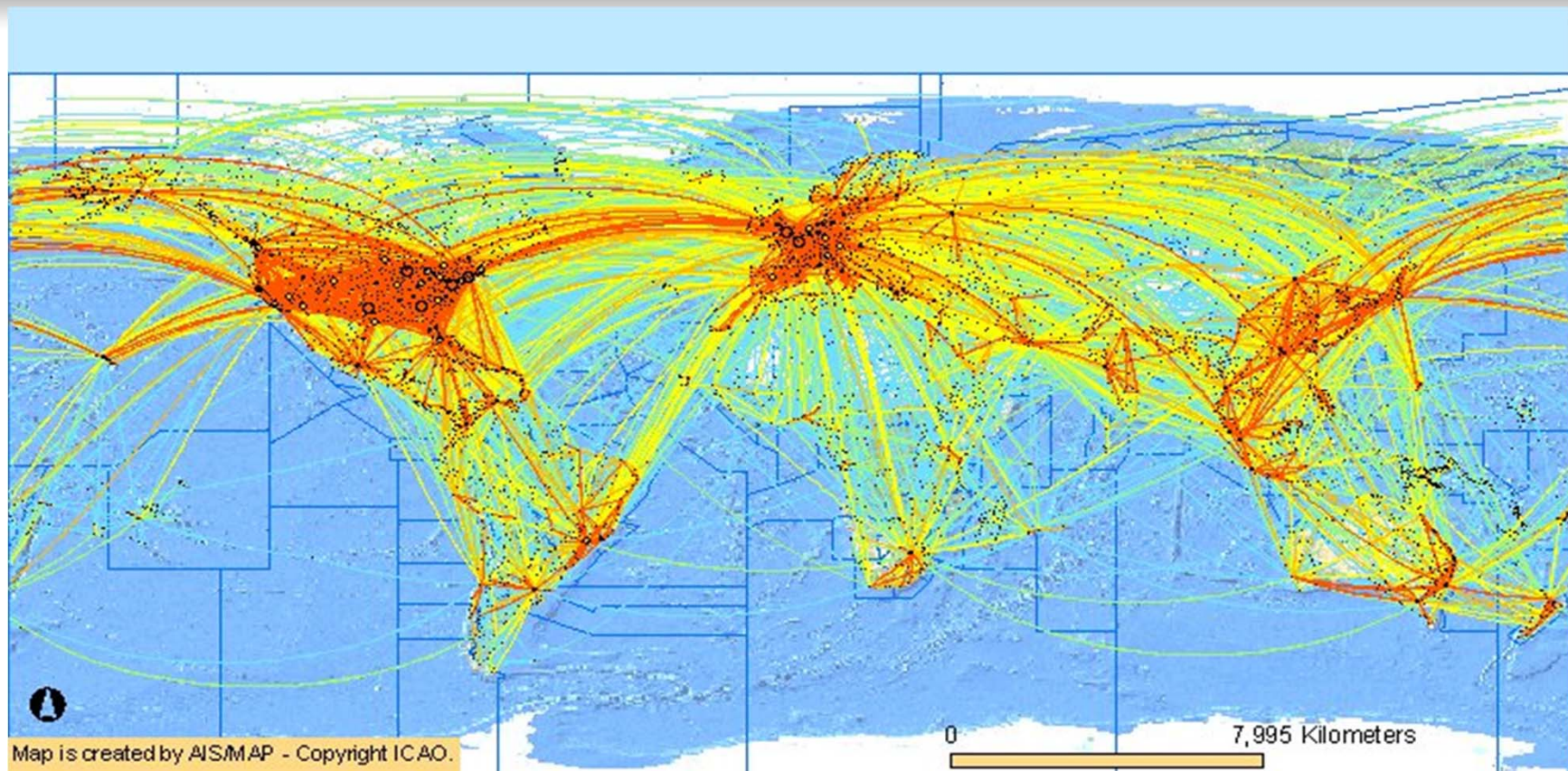
Re/N/ANP

- The regional and national planning process should be aligned and used to identify those elements which best provide solutions to the operational needs identified and build a seamless system



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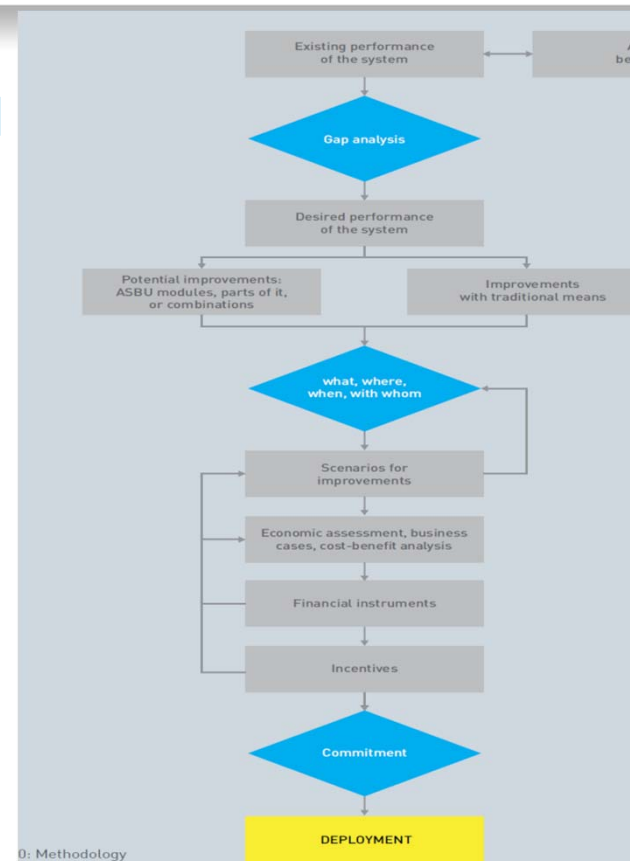

Deployment

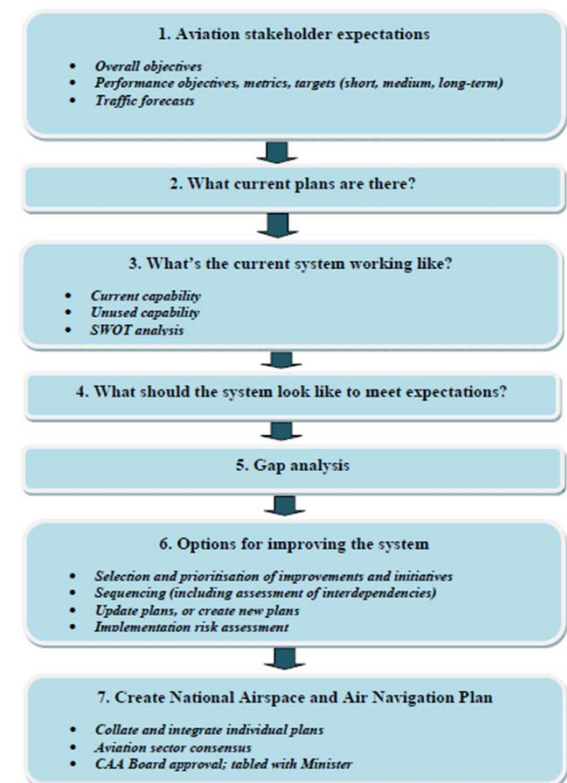
- Considered as an integral part of the global and regional planning process through the PIRGs
