- → Improved airport accessibility using Performance-based Navigation (PBN)
- → Improved flexibility and efficiency in departure profiles Continuous Climb Operations (CCO)

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Block 0: Capabilities within our grasp

PBN

- → PBN is today and we have to implement now:
 - → Main enabler for runway safety
 - → Increase accessibility of airports
 - → Increase of airspace efficiency
 - Environmental solutions (noise and emissions)
- PBN is the key building block for next generation airspace concepts (SESAR, NextGen, CARATS, etc.)






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Block 0: Capabilities within our grasp CDO and CCO

- CDO and CCO provide significant benefits in terms of:
 - → Fuel burn reduction
 - Gaseous emissions reduction
 - → Noise reduction
- → CDO and CCO enabled by Performance-based Navigation



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Beyond Planning...

ICAO and its partners are already addressing roll-out of PBN and associated airspace design features such as CDO and CCO.

But assistance and full support from all our aviation stakeholders is needed.

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Proposals to the CT Harmonization of Ops Approvals

- → Objective:
 - → Push PBN
- → Current Challenge:
 - → Different ops approval regulatory requirements in major States
- → Proposal:
 - → ICAO offers to host a harmonization meeting in November.
- → Result:
 - → Proposed revised ops approval requirements by January 2012

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Proposals to the CT

Need for Agreement on Navspecs for Block 0

- Objective:
 - Push PBN
- Current Challenge:
 - New PBN Navigation Specifications (navspecs) are required to complement existing navspecs needed for Block 0
 - Different approaches in aviation community on the way forward
- Proposal:
 - IATA, CANSO and IFALPA to review need for Advanced RNP, RNP 2 and RNP 0.3 navigation specification by Dec 2011.
- Result:
 - Agreement on way forward on navspec complement.

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Proposals to the CT PBN Business Case

- → Objective:
 - 7 Push PBN
- Current Challenge:
 - State business case often do not include all stakeholders
- Proposal:
 - → ICAO offers to develop a business case template to assist States by Spring 2012.
- → Result:
 - Template to assist States close a coordinated Business case involving all aviation stakeholders

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Proposals to the CT **Training**

- Objective:
 - Push PBN, CDO and CCO
- Current Challenge:

 PBN, CDO and CCO implementation constitutes a paradigm shift. Training not readily available, impediment for implementation.
- Proposal:

 A CANSO/IFATCA to develop training package for Controllers (2nd qrt 2012)

 A IATA/IFALPA to develop training package for airline pilots (2nd qrt 2012)

 BAC/IAOPA to develop training package for GA (2nd qrt 2012)

 ICAO/IATA to develop training package for ops approval (2nd qrt/2012)

 ICAO/IATA to develop training package for airspace design (1st qrt/2012)
- - Adequate education basis for PBN, CDO and CCO implementation

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Proposals to the CT Expedite PBN/CDO/CCO Implementation

- → Objective:
 - → Push PBN, CDO and CCO
- Current Challenge:
 - → States lack knowledge on how to implement PBN, CDO's and CCO's.
- Proposal:
 - ICAO to develop CCO technical guidance material
 - ✓ ICAO/IATA Go-Team concept to be adapted to:
 - a) Include State contract for PBN implementation (Dec. 2011)
 - → b) Carry-out a sample implementation project per visit (e.g. one arrival) (Feb. 2012)
 - → All CT members increase support to the Go-Teams (Now)
- - Expedition of PBN, CDO's and CCOs implementation

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Final remarks

- Capabilities with in our grasp. Don't let it slip through your fingers....
- PBN is the key stepping stone and affects all corners. In order to create a sound basis for the future of our air navigation system we all need to contribute, starting now.

 - → Coordinate within your organizations to establish clear actions
