- EGNOS Africa JPO is a key outcome of the Joint Africa-EU Strategy (JAES) regarding Africa-EU cooperation on satellite navigation 3rd Africa-EU Summit in 2010 in Tripoli. Brussels Africa-EU Summit in 2014 commitment by Programme sponsors
- Operationalization of Africa-EU cooperation on satellite navigation: The ACP/EC framework Programme 'Support to the Air Transport and Satellite services applications in Africa' (SAFIR) was launched in 2012.
- Two projects of the framework Programme, SAFIR and TREGA, addressed the Set-up, staffing and operationalization of JPO plus capacity building for African stakeholders through working sessions.
- Continuity of JPO is ensured through The **Pan'Af programme**, adopted in November 2015, with the 'Support to EGNOS in Africa' Programme.
- Third Phase of the Programme planned to cover **2021 up to 2024 period, with** sustainability of the JPO as a cornerstone of the strategy.




Beneficiaries under working arrangements




SBAS development in Africa: Coordination in Aviation




How can JPO support SBAS in Africa – Communication & Outreach events
