SUMMARY

SADISOPSG/19-WP/24 by IATA noted 25 U.S. aerodromes without required TAF information during IATA's monitoring period in 2013. This paper provides a response.

1. **INTRODUCTION**

1.1 Part IV from Appendix 1 to WP/24 from SADISOPSG/19 by IATA provides a table listing of aerodromes where METARs and/or TAFs were not provided. There were 25 aerodromes listed for the U.S.

2. **DISCUSSION.**

2.1 Of the 25 U.S. aerodromes noted, 3 have regularly scheduled TAF service from the U.S. National Weather Service (NWS):

- KAFW (Fort Worth Alliance, Texas),
- KLRU (Las Cruces, New Mexico), and
- KPTK (Pontiac, Michigan)

2.2 One aerodrome has seasonal TAF service, KOSH (Oshkosh, Wisconsin) where TAFs are only provided during the EAA AirVenture fly-in (late July into early August).

- 2.3 The remaining 21 aerodromes have no TAF service by the NWS. They are:
 - PABA
 - PACZ
 - PAEH
 - PALU
 - PANT
 - PATC
 - KALN
 - KAPG
 - KBKL

 - KCIU
 - KESF
 - KFRG
 - KHFD
 - KIKK
 - KIRK
 - KLBL
 - KMYV
 - KSBD
 - KTIW
 - KELO

2.4 As such, the TAFs for KAFW, KLRU and KPTK will be added to the OPMET service. The remaining 21 will be removed from the non-AOP tables.

3.1 The U.S. thanks IATA for monitoring OPMET information.

3.2 The WIFS Provider State will work with the SADIS Provider State to update Annex 1 and 2 of the SADIS Users Guide.
