Major Outcomes of the Symposium

- 1. African States to keep the momentum in improving safety and air navigation performance in Africa, which is an essential catalyst for economic development
- 2. African States to take ownership of and implement the Abuja aviation safety targets
- 3. African authorities were re-engaged and motivated in implementing actions aimed to address the obstacles inhibiting air transport development

Main obstacles recognized

- Long-term sustainability of air transport (CAAs and operators)
- Empowerment and financial sustainability of regional bodies (RSOOs)
- Hiring, training and retaining qualified and skilled staff
- High turnaround of CAA DGs and managers
- Protectionism, visa policies, complexity of regional frameworks

Major Outcomes of the Symposium

- 4. We recognized the efforts made by the international community in supporting safety and air navigation performance in Africa
- 5. Aviation safety partners to convince their development agencies to continue providing assistance and resources to attain the Abuja safety targets, improve safety and air navigation performance
- 6. Continue working with ICAO in coordinating assistance projects focusing on the most urgent needs and long term capacity building
