1 INTRODUCTION

- 1.1 The Meeting on the establishment of the Safety Management and Oversight Sub-Group (SMO/SG) of the Africa–Indian Ocean Aviation System Planning and implementation Group (AASPG) was held from 24 to 25 April 2025 at the Trademark Hotel, in Nairobi, Kenya.
- 1.2 The meeting was attended by fifty (50) participants from fifteen (15) States of the AFI region, eight (8) regional and international organizations and the ICAO ESAF and WACAF Regional Offices.

2 **DISCUSSION**

- 2.1 The meeting deliberated on seven Agenda Items and formulated two draft Decisions and two Conclusions.
- 2.2 The following States have been designated as core members of the SMO/SG: Cameroon, Cote d'Ivoire, Gabon, Gambia, Ghana, Kenya, Mauritania, Mozambique, Namibia, Rwanda, South Africa, Uganda, Togo and Zambia.
- 2.3 Mr. Lawrence Amukono from the Republic of Kenya and Mr. Kone Klédjomoh Ousmane from the Republic of Cote d'Ivoire have been elected respectively as Chairperson and Vice-chairperson of the SMO Sub-group.
- 2.4 To support the project-based activities of the SMO Sub-Group, States and organizations were invited to nominate qualified subject matter experts to participate in the Project Teams, ensuring that nominees meet the specific requirements of each project.
- 2.5 States were also requested to cooperate by releasing and sponsoring their nominated subject matter experts for participation in the implementation of the SMO/SG projects; and to allocate relevant resources as may be considered necessary.
- 2.6 The meeting also made the following recommendations to States:
 - Expedite the implementation of RASG-AFI/9 Conclusion 9/09 on Accident Investigation Reports and RASG-AFI/10;
 - Effectively implement Conclusion 10/04 on ACAS II (Version 7.1); and.
 - Support the efforts of the Collaborative Aviation Safety Improvement Programme (CASIP) in addressing key safety challenges in the following focus areas: Runway Safety; Aeronautical Information Quality; Communication Shortfalls; Safety Leadership and Safety Culture Development; Loss of Separation (TCAS-related); Ground Damage to Aircraft; Wildlife Hazard Management; Rescue and Firefighting Services; and Operations in environments with Significant Safety Concerns (SSCs).
- 2.7 The meeting emphasized the necessity for effective coordination between the subgroups of the AASPG (IIM, AAO, SMO Sub-Groups). In this respect, the meeting agreed on a list of common areas addressing organizational and operational safety issues such as the timely implementation of ICAO Standards and Recommended Practices (SARPs); the integration of new entrants into the aviation ecosystem; runway safety; and safety data collection and sharing.
- 2.8 During the meeting on the establishment of the Safety Management and Oversight Sub-Group (SMO/SG), the group discussed and agreed on the following areasfor potential development into projects:

- a) Strengthening of State safety oversight systems;
- b) Development and implementation of Regional and National Aviation Safety Plans (AFI-RASP and NASPs);
- c) Establishment of Safety Data Collection and Processing Systems (SDCPS);
- d) Safety management;
- e) Aircraft accident and incident investigation (AIG); and
- f) Improved monitoring of SMO/SG-related conclusions and decisions.
- 2.9 The meeting requested that the Secretariat, in coordination with SMO/SG members, conduct a comprehensive review of these proposed areas with a goal of proposing corresponding projects, considering regional needs, priorities, and the availability of resources.
