Revised Abuja Safety Targets -2024

of	e review and alignment of the Abuja Safety Targets were conducted through a series technical consultations, including: Expert Working Group sessions; A validation workshop held from 23–25 January 2024 at AFCAC Headquarters; A Stakeholder Validation Workshop held virtually on 28 March 2024. Targets are now simpler, measurable, and aligned with the 6 ICAO GASP Goals and performance indicators outlined in regional plans such as the AFI-RASP (2023–2025).
Th	e Revised Targets were:
	Presented and endorsed at the 35 th AFCAC Plenary Session held from 26–27 November 2024; and
	Adopted by Ministers during the 3 rd Extraordinary Session of the AU STC-TIITE from 3–5 December 2024.

Revised Abuja Safety Targets -2024

AFCAC has initiated work to develop a continental Action Plan and Monitoring Mechanism to support implementation and assess progress across Member States.

Member States are expected to:

- ☐ Establish national Abuja Safety Targets Action Plans;
- □ Periodically report implementation status and challenges to AFCAC; and
- ☐ Participate in data-sharing and capacity-building initiatives in coordination with ICAO and other partners.

The status of implementation, including challenges faced by States, will be periodically reported to the AU STC-TIITE through AFCAC.



Timeline & Stakeholder Roles


