International Airports - Any airport designated by the Contracting State in whose territory it is situated as an airport of entry and departure for international air traffic, where the formalities incident to customs, immigration, public health, animal and plant quarantine and similar procedures are carried out. Must have an international traffic of at least 10 traffic units performed per year.

International Passenger Traffic - The total number of international passengers, on both scheduled and charter services, at international airports located on the territory of your State.

International Cargo Traffic - The total volume of freight shipped to and from international airports located on the territory of your State.

National Airlines with International Services - Any duly registered and certificated air transport enterprise in your State and that operates scheduled or charter international air services to any other State. Must have an international traffic of at least 10 traffic units performed per year.

4 Looking to the Future

- Currently under development and due to begin operations in 2020, the New Mexico City International Airport will be one of the three largest in the world and the largest and most modern in Latin America.
- Initially, the new airport will feature three runways for simultaneous take-offs and landings; it will accommodate 550 000 aircraft movements and 50 million passengers a year. Ultimately, it will have two terminals and six runways that will permit three aircraft to land and/or take off at the same time. The capacity will increase to 120 million passengers annually.
- Already, there have been extensions and modifications to the existing Mexico City International Airport for wide-body aircraft such as the Airbus A380, that began regular operations in January 2016.
- In 2016, the Training Centre ASA-Airbus became the first of its kind in Latin America. The facility will provide training and instruction to Mexican and foreign pilots flying the A320 family of aircraft. Among its many features is a state-of-the-art flight simulator.

5 Did You Know... Travel and Tourism

In Mexico, there are 33 World Heritage Sites, and seven traditions and festivities recognized as Intangible Cultural Heritage by UNESCO. This makes Mexico the Latin American country with the greatest number of UNESCO sites and events that world travellers should visit and take part in.

Foreign Airlines - Any duly registered and certificated air transport enterprise from any other State and that operates scheduled or charter international air services to your State (for statistical purposes, cabotage flights should be considered as traffic performed in the reporting State). Must have a total traffic of at least 10 traffic units performed per year in the reporting State.
