Dear Mr Benjamin,

I have the honor to thank you for your letter regarding the Resolution A/37-10: Proficiency in the English language used for the radiotelephony communications.

I would like to inform you that, by the Order of the Director General of Civil Aviation Agency of Montenegro, which entered in force on February 23 2011, all pilots, ATC controllers, flight navigators, flight engineers and radio station operators holding licenses issued by CAA of Montenegro have to comply with the ICAO language proficiency requirements contained in Annexes 1, 6, 10 and 11.

The above mentioned Order is based on Article 115 of the Law on Air Transport in Montenegro.

Therefore, since February 23 2011, legislation in Montenegro is fully compliant with Annex 1 to the Chicago Convention with regard to language proficiency in aviation.


Our particular attention has been paid to the pilots working for AOC operators based in Montenegro and we can confirm that all professional pilots operating internationally obtained the Language Proficiency endorsement on their license in advance of the 5th March deadline.

Additionally, all current air traffic controllers were assessed to be at least Level 4 Proficiency in the English language, in accordance with the ICAO language proficiency standards.

I would like to inform you that the Focal point for Language proficiency in Montenegro is Mr. Mileta Nikolic, Director of Safety department of the Civil Aviation Agency of Montenegro (e-mail: mnikolic@caa.me).
