The United States has reviewed ICAO Letter AN 12/44.6-07/68, dated October 26, 2007, requesting States to note Assembly Resolution A36-11, where applicable; develop a language proficiency implementation plan by March 5, 2008; notify ICAO with the names and contact details of language proficiency focal points; and notify ICAO of differences to language proficiency requirements contained in Annexes 1, 6, 10, and 11.


No differences exist between the national regulations and/or practices of the United States and the language provisions as detailed in Table 1, paragraph 3 of Attachment B to State letter AN 12/44.6-07/68.
