**Additional Protocol No. 3. Not in force: 30 ratifications by signatory States required. 21 ratifications. In addition, 11 instruments of ratification which are not reflected in this table have been received from the following States which have not signed the Protocol: Azerbaijan, Bahrain, Ecuador, Guinea, Honduras, Kenya, Lebanon, Mauritius, Nauru, Niger and Turkey. In accordance with Article IX of the Protocol, these instruments can be formally deposited as instruments of ratification after the signature of the Protocol or as instruments of accession after the entry into force of the Protocol.

***Cape Town Convention. In addition, the Syrian Arab Republic, Zimbabwe, Gabon, the Republic of Moldova, Seychelles, Costa Rica and Burkina Faso have deposited their instruments of accession in respect of this Convention. In accordance with its Article 49(2), the Convention shall enter into force for these States as applied to aircraft equipment when they accede to the Aircraft Equipment Protocol (Cape Town, 2001).
